The structure is a typical one classroom prairie school house of wood frame construction on with entrance/exit attached extensions on the east and west elevations. The entire structure is resting on a rock and concrete foundation.

The east addition has two windows facing east and one window facing north with an entrance/exit door facing south. , This entrance into the school has an external wood landing with two wood steps. The east entry way has a door facing west into the classroom.

The west extension of the school also has an exit/entrance door to the south. With attached wood porch with two access steps. This addition held the coal bin for heating the school and two toilets. There is one window facing north in this addition.

At one time, there were two outdoor toilets and a barn located west of the school.

The interior classroom section of the school has four windows on the north side and two on the south side.

Wood lap siding covers the structure. Asphalt shingles replace the original wood shingles. The chimney is made of brick. A wood flag pole is attached to the east elevation of the main classroom structure. The school is wired for electricity.

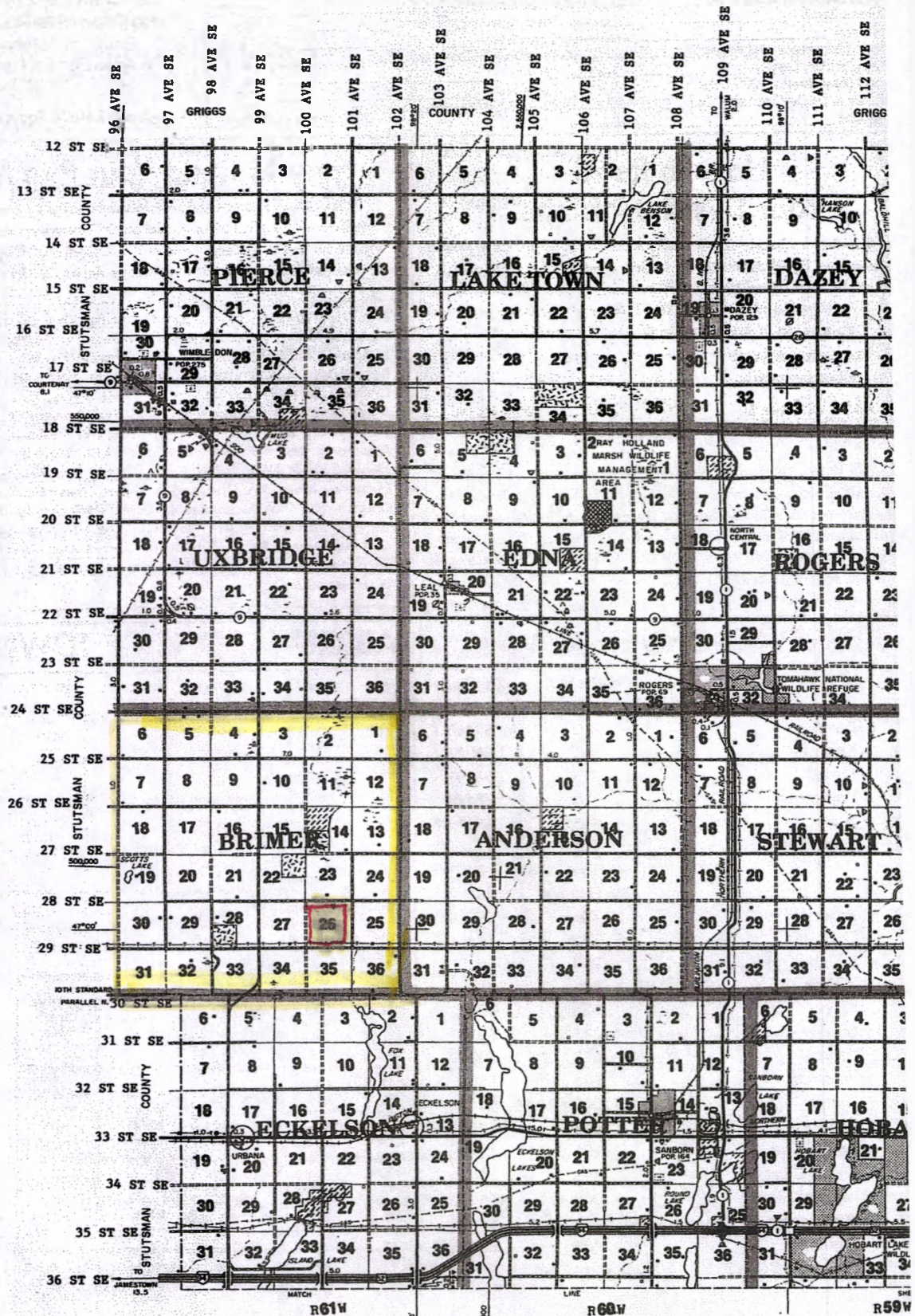
Brimer School closed in the 1960's. The last teacher was Mrs. Bea McClean, a local resident who died in 1993. Following the closing of the school, township meetings were then held there as well the school serving as a polling precinct for state and national elections. The school had been repainted after closing and some window glass had been replaced... A used oil stove has replaced the former coal stove. The school has been vandalized several times over the years it has remained unused. Brimer Township opted to join Precinct #8 and the school has not been used since.

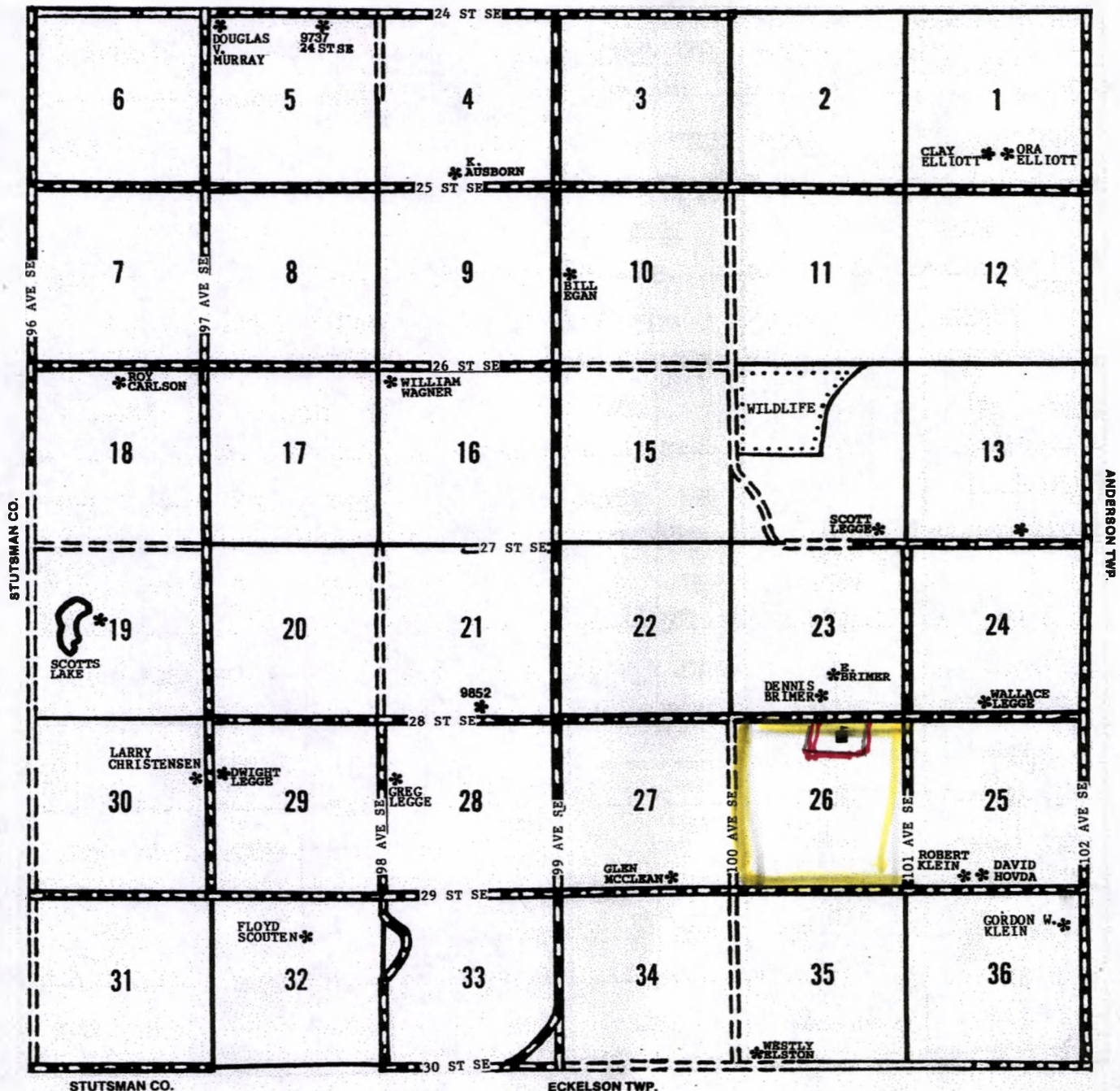

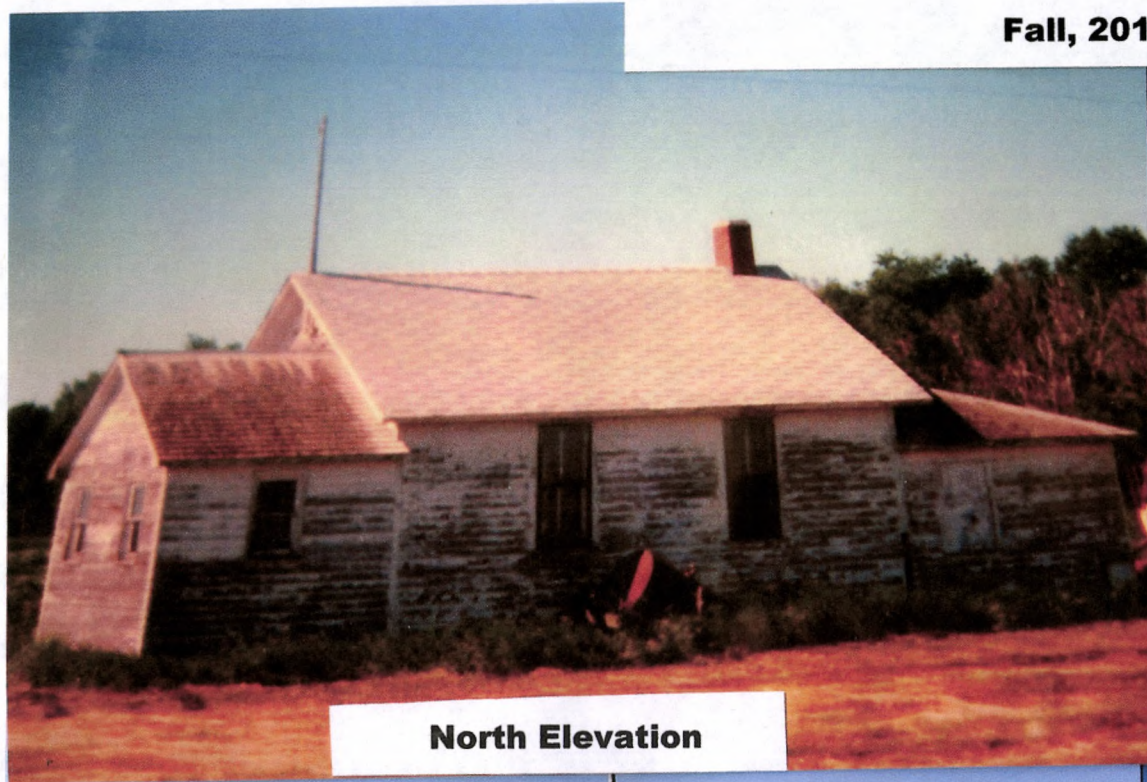

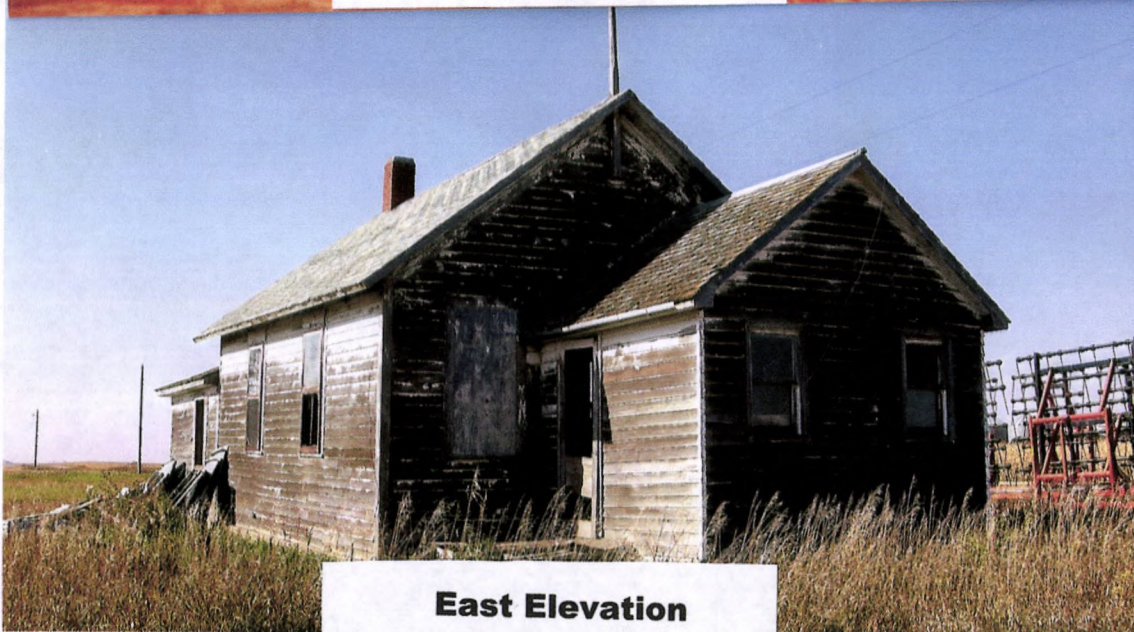
