1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

The feature is a one room prairie school on a poured concrete foundation. This school was moved to the current location to be part of a Heritage Village. The roof of the school is covered with cedar shingles and there is a newer concrete block chimney near the west end at the peak of the roof. The soffits are closed.

There is a wide trim board under the peak ends of the school with the remaining siding being 6 inch wood lap with 4 inch wood lap corner trim. A concrete pad leads to a 5 panel wood door at the entry. The interior wall of the entry that is the school building has siding like the exterior leading to speculation that the entry was added at a later date than when the school was constructed. The school has good paint. Wide wood beadboard covers all the walls and the ceiling in the school building as well as most of the entry. There is a railing running along all the walls at the height of the bottom of the windows. The walls are painted blue and the ceiling is painted white. There are 3 double hung, 2 over 2, windows on both the north and south sides with all glass intact. A second 5 panel wood door gives entry into the school room. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood. There are three blackboards, two on the west end either side of the chimney and one on the north half of the entry wall. The school has been decorated with student desks, teachers desk, books and other items commonly seen in the early one room schools. Wiring on the outside of the school building incidates that electricity was present at some time int he past.
