1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

Feature 2 is a re-purposed front gabled schoolhouse. A porch appears to have been removed from the east elevation, but a panel door with a three-light window is extant. No other windows are visible. The structure is clad in horizontal wooden siding. The roof is clad with corrugated metal, with vents visible.

The feature could not be fully recorded due to lack of permission to access the property. As such, SWCA recommends the feature remains unevaluated regarding its National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) eligibility pending full recordation.

6. *Summary of ALL* Site Features & Evaluation of Significance:

This property includes several features: a late 20th century house (Feature 1), a schoolhouse (Feature 2), and a large number of early 20th century farm outbuildings that include a monitor barn (Feature 3), a large granary (Feature 4), three chicken houses (Features 5-7), two garages (Features 8 and 9), a potato barn or silage storage barn, (Feature 10), a small granary (Feature 11), and several smaller outbuildings (Features 12-14). Four mid-twentieth century grain bins are also located on the site (Features 15 and 17), and a late 20th century machine shed also stands on the property (Feature 16).

This property is a site lead; it is located outside of the project area and access was limited, so buildings were not fully recorded.

This site was not evaluated for National Register of Historic Places eligibility, but it contains a wide variety of intact early-20th century farm outbuildings and a schoolhouse, and may be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. Additional research is recommended to document the history of this property.

HISTORIC BACKGROUND

SWCA conducted research to identify and locate records of any historic landowners, homesteads, trails, roads, stage stops, mines, or other historic entities within the project area that could fall under the Criteria of Eligibility for the NRHP. This research included a review of the 1876 General Land Office (GLO) survey map for T137N, R78W (North Dakota State Water Commission 2017) and a search of online GLO land patent records (BLM 2017).

The 1876 GLO map (North Dakota State Water Commission 2017) depicts no human-made features within Section 29. A drainage crosses the north half of the section.

Land patent records indicate that one land patent was granted for lands containing the site lead in 1895 (BLM 2017) (Table 5). During the inventory, SWCA located no cultural resources that could be confidently associated with the patentee.

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


Figure 5. Features 4 (center) and 2 (right), facing northwest.
