

#### DESCRIPTION/INTEGRITY/ELIGIBILITY

1.1

This substantial school building stands just northwest of the town of Gascoyne. Its main entry faces south, but it has an exterior cellar door on the west side near the southwest corner. This is a wood frame building on a poured concrete foundation. It has a truncated hip roof that has been shingled with asphalt shingles. The exterior is horizontal wood siding. There are tall, narrow, double-hung windows on all sides of the building. The main entry is approached by concrete stairs. Over it is a gabled roof. Only one of the two original pillars supporting this entry remains. This entry has double doors with a semi-circular window arrangement above the doors. The building has a full basement in which at one time, local informants say, the school played basketball games. The main floor is divided into three classrooms. The main entry leads into a hall and cloak room. There is a small classroom on either side of this hall and a large classroom at the end of this hall. The school likely was constructed in the 1910s.

Unfortunately, the schoolhouse has fallen into serious disrepair. The poor condition of the foundation and structural system make it an unlikely candidate for restoration.

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The hint of Neo-classicism conveyed by the pillars and other details around the front entrance of the school are insufficient to achieve National Register significance on the basis of design, but the building possesses National Register significance on the basis of association with the history of education in North Dakota. This building housed classes for two generations of students in the Gascoyne area until its consolidation into the Scranton system.

The integrity of the building holds strong in most respects. One aspect of integrity that has deteriorated is setting, for the community that the school served, Gascoyne, has declined physically and demographically, and as structures continue to be removed, the school appears more an more an isolated building in the countryside and less the community institution it once was.

The other problem with integrity has to do with the physical deterioration of the building. The basement, scene of many school activities in its heyday, is partially collapsed. Key architectural features around the front entrance are damaged or gone. The deterioration is severe enough that it may affect the building's eligibility for the National Register. On the other hand, the external features other than those of the front entry are largely in place. Overall, the building merits National Register consideration.


