## DESCRIPTION/INTEGRITY/ELIGIBILITY

This is a country schoolhouse that has been moved to the west side of the farmstead and used for storage. The wood frame building has been set on a foundation of poured concrete. Its windows have been covered over. The gable roof, covered with asphalt shingles, has been patched with sheet metal. The main entry of the schoolhouse has been removed and opened up with a large door for vehicle access.

The relocation and modification of this schoolhouse damage its integrity and make it ineligible for the National Register.

## DESCRIPTION/INTEGRITY/ELIGIBILITY

This is another country schoolhouse moved to the southwest corner of the farmstead and converted into a granary. It is a wood frame building on a foundation of concrete piers. The windows have been boarded up. The original entry of the school faces south. Openings have been cut into the roof to admit grain. Iron rods have been inserted through the walls and tightened inside to brace the building.

The relocation and modification of the schoolhouse damage its integrity and make it ineligible for the National Register.

 Elmer Eien was born on this place. Eleanor was born in Canada. Her father, from Wisconsin, "had itchy feet," headed for the Peace River country, met her mother in Saskatchewan, moved back to Wisconsin, but, she says, "had been on the prairie too long, couldn't take the trees anymore," and so moved out to the Scranton area in Bowman County. Elmer's father and mother, homesteaders, were Erick and Pernella Eien from Norway. He married Pernella in Iowa.

They took up this homestead in 1904 and proved it up in 1907. There followed the series of additions as described in the site form.


Eleanor says, "we should be retired, but he's out there summer-fallowing right now. He's got his feet in the soil."

In the living room of the new house is a fireplace made of petrified wood and of other rocks that Eleanor picked up in the fields. She did this when she was summer-fallowing. Elmer would say, "work that summer fallow, don't be picking up those rocks!" Eleanor would say, "if you picked them up, I wouldn't have to!" Eleanor says, "I always did the summer-fallowing;" also, "I always wanted a fireplace."
