DESCRIPTION/INTEGRITY/ELIGIBILITY

This is the most architecturally distinctive one-room schoolhouse in Bowman County --Langberg School. This is a wood frame building on a foundation of uncut stone. The exterior is covered with horizontal wood siding in good condition. The roof has been re-covered with asphalt shingles. The gable is aligned north and south. At the south end, centered, arises a square bell tower topped with a smaller louvered bell chamber, and atop this a pointed hip roof. The entrance to the school is by a front door on the south wall of this bell tower. On the gable near the north end of the roof is a brick chimney. Five tall, double-hung windows line the east wall of the schoolhouse. There is another double-hung window on the south wall on either side of the bell tower. There is a poured concrete step at the front entrance. Inside the foyer under the bell tower, the area is in an unfinished state. A door leads from this into a cloak room, and a door from that into the classroom. The classroom contains some junk, but is in a good state of preservation -- blackboard, plaster walls, and wood ceiling all contact. To the left of the cloak room as you enter is a closet accessible only by a door from the classroom. There is some broken down playground equipment remaining on the school grounds.

The integrity of this building is outstanding in all respects. It is visually prominent on a well-traveled intersection in Bowman County. Its integrity, along with its unusually attractive design, make this the only one room schoolhouse in Bowman County that should be considered for the National Register. It merits individual consideration, or, should get linked in a thematic consideration with similar examples in other counties.


