1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

The feature is a one room prairie school house on a foundation of poured concrete. The gable foor is covered with asphalt shingles over wood shakes. There is metal capping and finials at the peak. The front of the school has decorative cornice returns at both the north and south corners of the eaves. There is no chimney. Remnants of a bell tower are at the peak at the south end of the school. The small roof, with the flag pole attached, hangs from the bell tower. The soffits are closed.

Rake boards begin the siding that continues with 6 inch wood lap on the north, east and west walls with 4 inch wood corner trim. The south side has wood shakes from the peak to just above the cornice returns with a decorative, diamond shaped piece in the middle. The remainder of the siding on the south side is 6 inch wood lap. A canopy hangs out above the door, this covered with asphalt shingles. A 5 panel wood door with a transom window above it give entry from a large concrete porch platform. Upon going into the entry door openings are seen to both the left and right. All interior doors are gone. They door openings to the coat rooms have decorative cornices and wide trim. The windows also have similar trim. The walls in the entry and main school room have lathe and plaster walls. The ceiling throughout has wallboard. Light fixtures in the ceiling are indicative of electricity. Doors opened into the school room from the entry and both coatrooms. All those doors are gone and they have some barricads to keep calves in the big room. The floor was cut from side to side just as you would step into the big room. The floor in the entry and coat rooms is tongue and groove hardwood, the floor in the remainder is straw covered dirt. There are four double hung, two over two, windows on the west side of the school room, one on the north and two more windows on the south side, one in each coat room. There is some glass, most of the framing and some are covered. As mentioned this building was used for housing calves. The north side of the school has a side sliding door. There are remnants of black boards on parts of the south and west walls as well as framing on the east wall where the blackboards have been removed
