1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

The feature is a one room prairie school moved to this location for use as a shop. It is sitting on a poured concrete foundation. The gable roof of the school was covered with wood shakes, many have fallen off. There is metal capping. The chimney is gone, replaced by a metal stove pipe that comes out the west wall and runs up the outside. The soffits are closed. The building measures 32 feet by 24 feet.

The walls are 6 inch wood lap covered with stucco. The entry for the school is located on the north side, very close to another building. The entry no longer has door, there is a window to the left of the door opening with some glass. There are lots of windows in the building, four double hung windows are located on the east wall and 7 more on the south side. All the windows have framing with some of the glass missing. To the right of the east windows there is an overhead garage door. The interior walls are a mixture of beadboard and wallboard. Very little wallboard remains on the ceiling leaving much it open to the failing roof. The floor is gone, it is a cement slab today. Remnants of a blackboard remain. There is electricity in the building.

This school opened in the early 1900's and closed in the 1953-1954 term.


4. Description of Access and Site Setting:

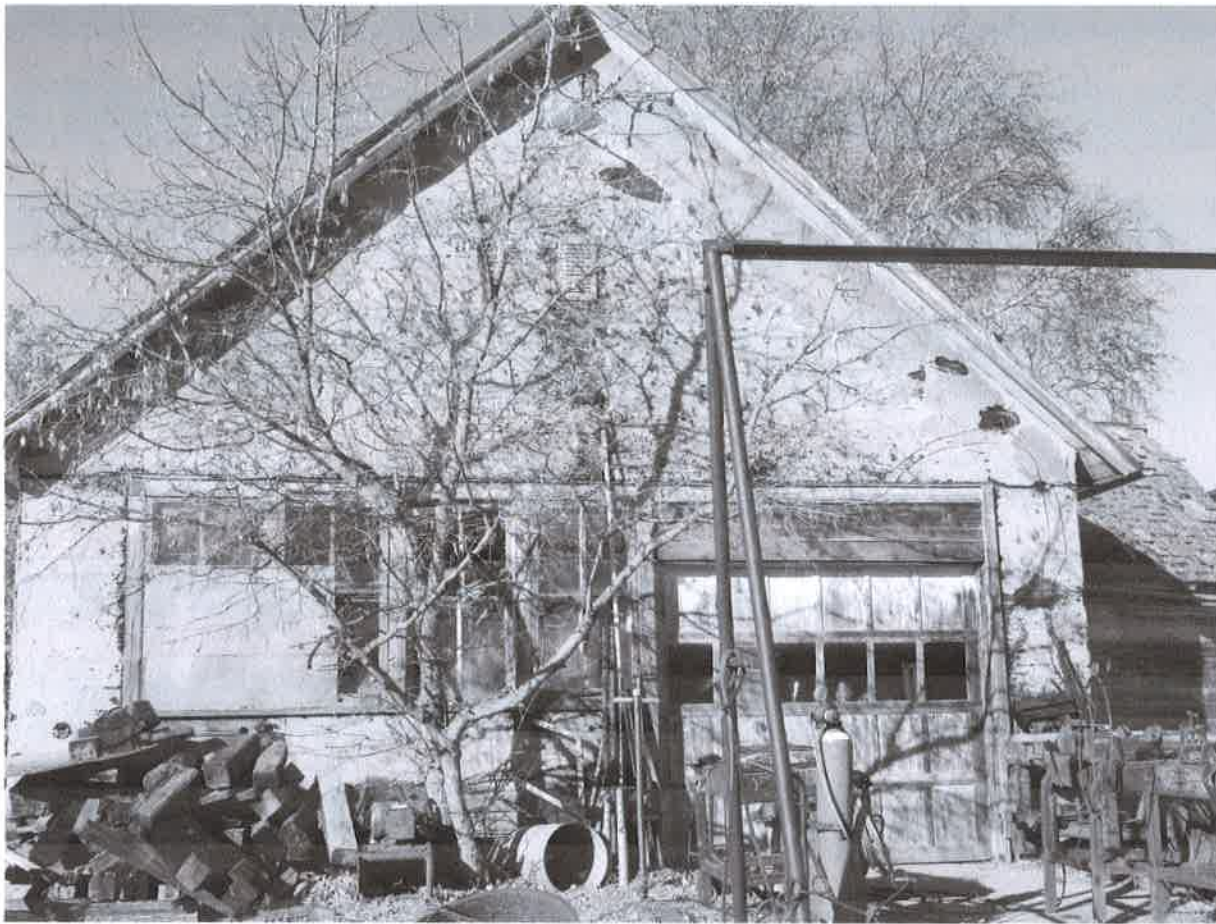

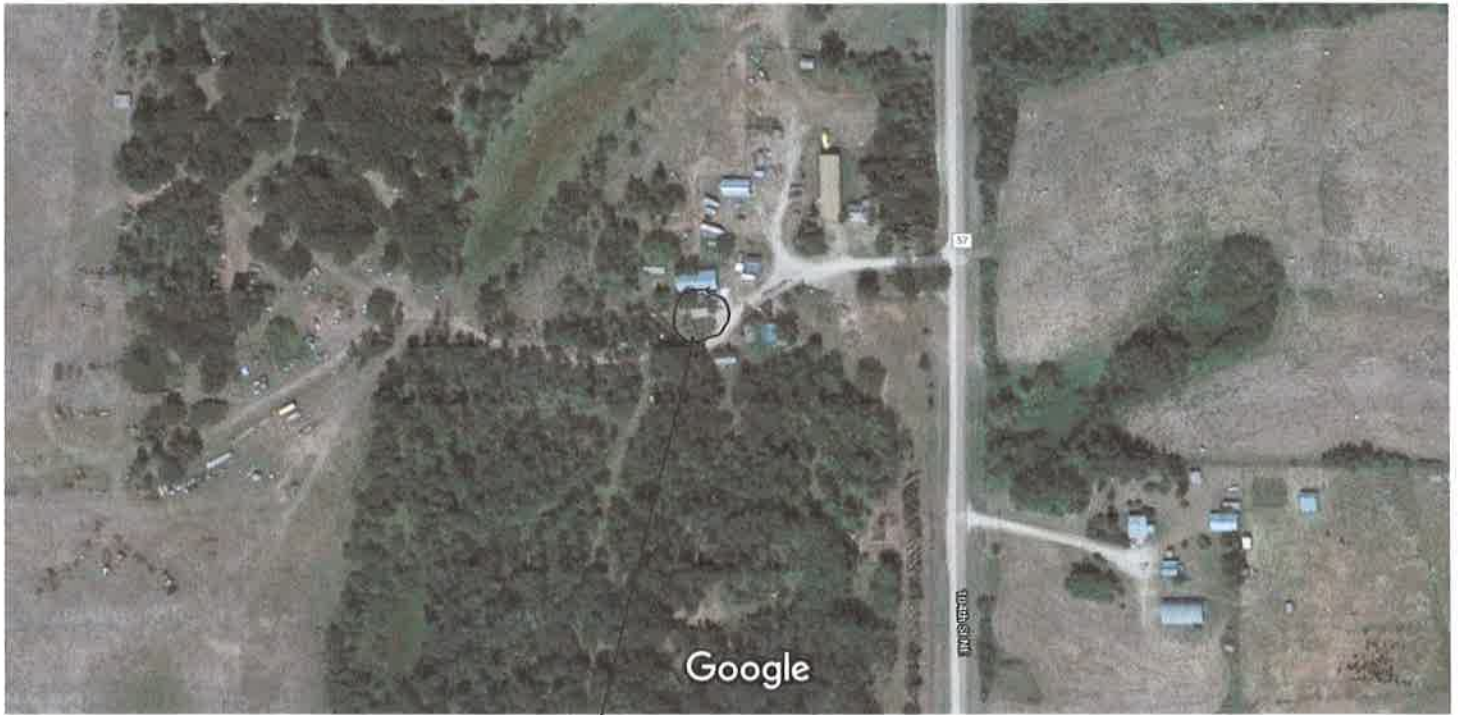
