1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

The feature is a one room prairie school sitting on a poured concrete foundation. The school was moved to this location for storage. The roof is starting to fail in on the north side. It is mostly covered with asphalt shingles over wood shakes. There is metal capping. There is a yellow brick chimney located inside the school, covered outside. Located above the door is a small asphalt shingled canopy supported by decorative brackets. The soffits are mostly closed as they are falling into disrepair. There are cornice returns on both the peak ends of the school. The school measures 34 feet long by 24 feet wide.

A rake board begins the siding at the peak ends as well as along the sides of the building. The remainder of the siding is 6 inch wood lap with 4 inch wood corner trim. There are double hung windows on three sides of the school, some with glass, some covered and all have original trim. Two windows are located on either side of the entry door. A bank of 4 windows is located on the north side, about half of which are covered with plywood. A bank of 4 more windows, with some glass, is located on the west side. A five panel wood door gives entry into the school. A transom window is located above the door, under the canopy. Above the transom window there is decorative siding in the shape of a fan rising above three part circles (sun trim). There is an entry area just inside the door that leads to a second 5 panel wood door which gives entry into the school. Two coat rooms are located on either side of the entry. The walls in the school are lathe and plaster with wainscot. The ceiling is wallboard and most of that has fallen in along with several of the boards supporting the ceiling. The exterior roof is also falling in. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood. There is a blackboard on the south wall. Light fixtures in the ceiling indicate the presence of electricity.

The school was used until 1962.
