This feature is a one room prairie school located in Pleasant Township. The foundation is concrete blocks. The gable roof has asphalt shingles with a grey concrete chimney. The soffits are closed. There is a flag pole at the south end of the peak of the roof and a small vent pipe on the east slope. The school sits on a farm and is used for storage today. The school was also called No. 8 "Odegaard" School.

A rake board running under the peak ends of the roof start the siding. The remainder is 6 inch wood lap with 4 inch wood corner trim. There are 7 double hung, 4 over 4 pane, windows on the east side of the school with most of the glass intact. There is one small double hung window on the west wall near the north end of the school, it is in the coat room. The entry is reached by three concrete steps to a concrete platform with metal railing either side. A 5 panel wood door gives access to the entry. There is a door canopy over the door which also has a transom window above it. There is a second 4 panel wood door for access into the school room. There are two small rooms to either side of the entry, one for coats and one for a possible bathroom as indicated by the vent pipe. The walls and ceiling are wallboard and the floor is tongue and groove hardwood. There are parts of blackboard on the south wall. Wires on the south side exterior wall indicate electricity. Wood was used to heat the school.

According to the photo caption for Institute for Regional Studies, NDSU, Fargo (2098.S2494), this school was built in 1878 and closed in 1961.

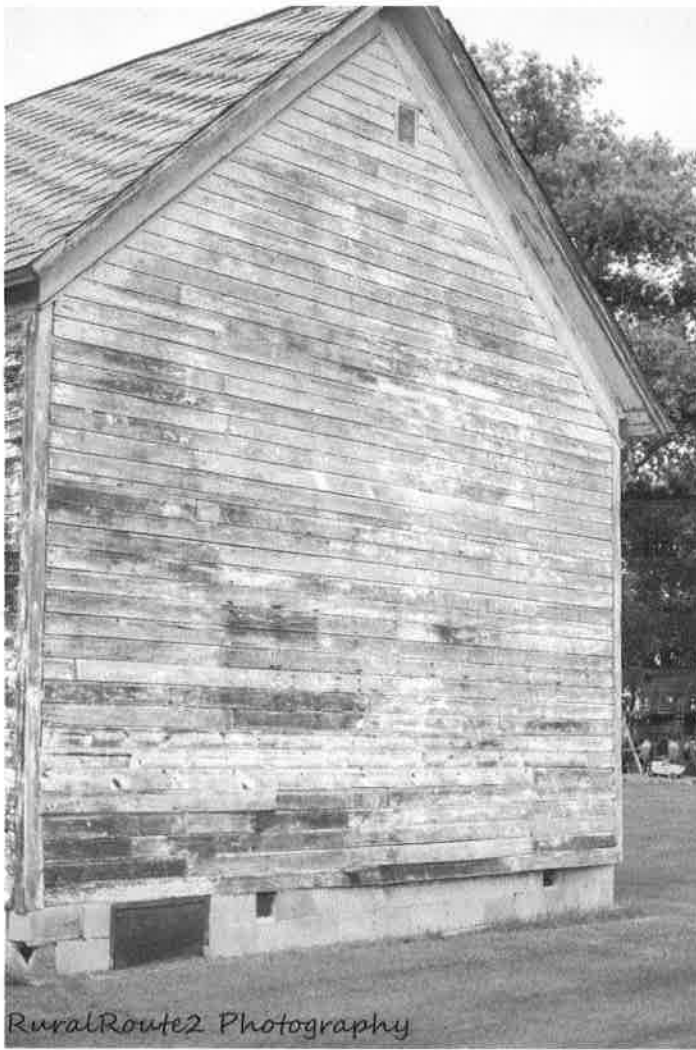
