The feature is a one room prairie school on a concrete foundation. This school has moved around a bit, first location was in East Alma Township where it was known as the Dyer School and it is thought it was built in the 1880's. In 1950 it was moved to Hay Township and acquired the name of Hay #1. In 1964 it was moved to Langdon and stood on the courthouse lot until it was moved to Dresden as part of the museum complex.

The gable roof of the main body and shed roof of the entry are covered with ribbed metal sheeting. There is a red brick chimney at the peak of the north end of the roof. The soffits are closed. The school measures 34 feet northwest to southeast and 18 1/2 feet northeast to southwest.

The siding is vinyl over wood lap. There are 3 double hung windows on both the northeast and southwest sides of the school. Some 2 over one, another three over one with yet another simply a single pane of glass over same. The window framing is original and the glass is intact. There is a 5 panel wood door for entry from a concrete stoop. The entry walls and ceiling are covered with wallboard. There are bookcases and many books in the entry. The interior walls slant toward the ceiling and both are finished with fiberboard panels with wood framing to cover seams. There is beadboard wainscot on the lower part of the walls. Blackboards are on the northwest wall, either side of the small stove. More blackboards are either side of the school room entry door. Light fixtures suggest electricity. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood. The school is furnished with desks, books, maps and other objects found in country schools.
