The feature is a one room prairie school on a concrete foundation. The hip roof of the school is covered with ribbed metal sheeting. There is a vent on the east slope of the roof and there is no chimney. The soffits are closed. There are eaves troughs on the school with downspouts at the corners on the west end. The building measures 28 feet east to west and 24 feet north to south. There is a wood step leading up to the entry door with wood railings.

There is a wide trim board under the soffits on all four side of the school. Remainder of the siding is 6 inch wood lap with 6 inch corner trim. The lower part of the wall has waterboard and another wide trim board. The entry has a newer, solid core, locked door. A transom window is above the door. There are two double hung windows to each side of the door, glass intact. On the south wall of the school there is a bank of 6 double hung, two over two, windows with all glass intact. Window shades pull down from the top of the window frame. The interior walls are wall board with beadboard wainscot. The ceiling is finished with wallboard and it angles toward the walls along the north and south sides. There are blackboards on 3/4 of the north wall, into the west corner, and cover about 1/2 of the west wall. At the entry, there is a wall directly in from the entry door and there is a hallway to either side for the bathrooms, girls on the left and boys on the right, and on to the coat room in the northeast corner and the washroom in the southeast corner. Two doors either side of the dividing wall give access to the school room. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood. Cupboards in the school room on the dividing wall and along part of the north wall hold many books and other school items. There are student desks, a teachers desk, more books and other items common to a one room school. There is a floor grate, used when the school was located on a basement in a previous location.

The school has been moved twice since it was built in 1929, first to a farm in 1980 and later moved to the museum location in Dunn Center. It was restored after the 1980 move.

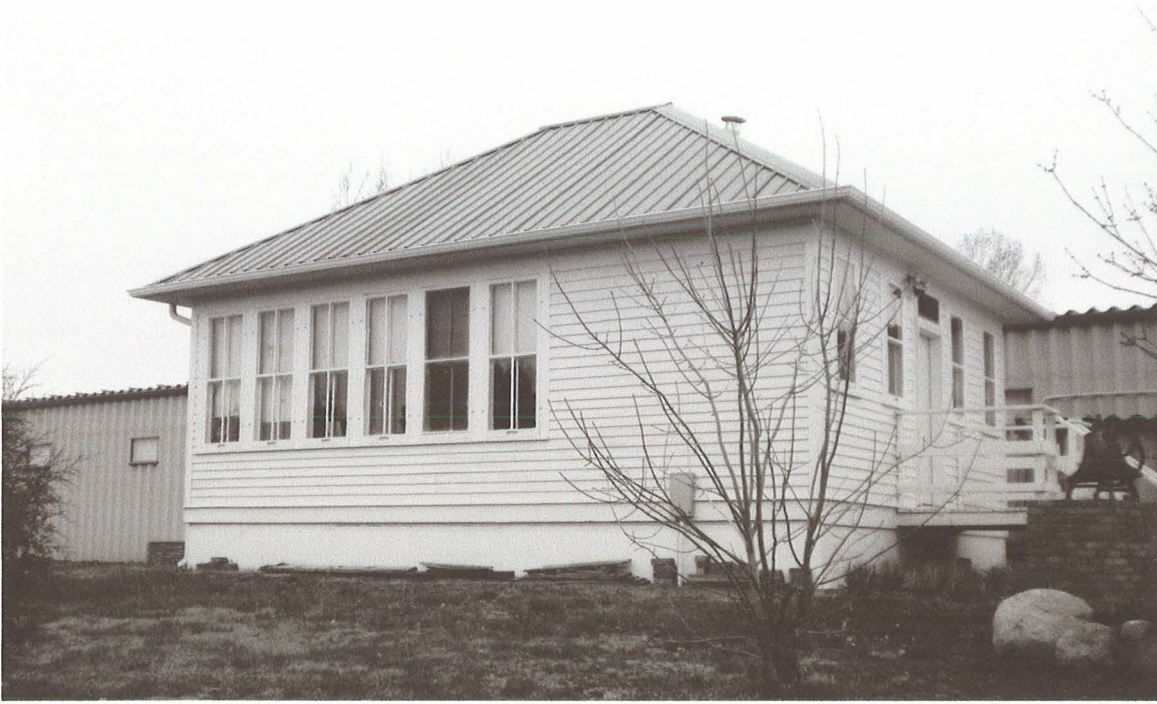

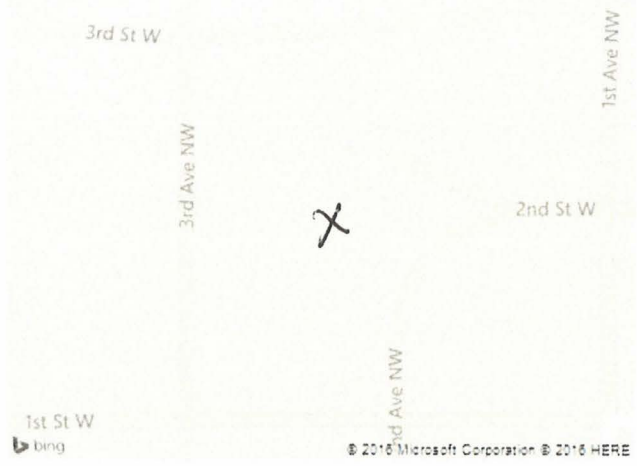
