This feature is a one room prairie school building sitting on railroad ties. The main body of the school measures 22 1/2 feet east to west and 32 1/2 feet north to south. The portion that I am guessing was an entry measures 16 1/2 feet east to west by 5 feet north to south. Roofing material is asphalt shingles. The school has a hip roof with a gable roofed entry. The soffit of the gable end is open and there is a half-moon window under the peak as well as an old light fixture. The soffits under the roof and the eave returns of the gable entry are finished with beadboard. Narrow trim boards are seen where the wide trim board meets the soffit as well as where the wide trim board meets the siding. Remnants of a brick chimney can be seen on the west slope of the roof near the south end of the school. 8 inch wide headers can be seen on all four sides above the siding under the roof overhang. The soffits are closed and finished with beadboard. The siding is 6 inch wood lap with 6 inch wood corner trim. There is a fancy molding at the top of all the corner pieces. There is a solid wood door at the southwest corner of the school, facing to the south. I suspect this door might have been added at a later date as back doors were not common in these country schools. Also on the south wall are two large pieces of plywood covering windows. A bank of windows is on the east wall, also covered with plywood. The windows are double hung with glass intact. The windows still have old shades. On the north side there is a large overhead door, installed in what most likely the outside wall of the entry when it was used as a school. There is an 5 panel wood and glass entry door on the north west corner. The interior has plywood on the walls and ceiling and with a blackboard on the north wall. There was electricity in the building but it is not connected today. The school was moved to its present location for use as storage.

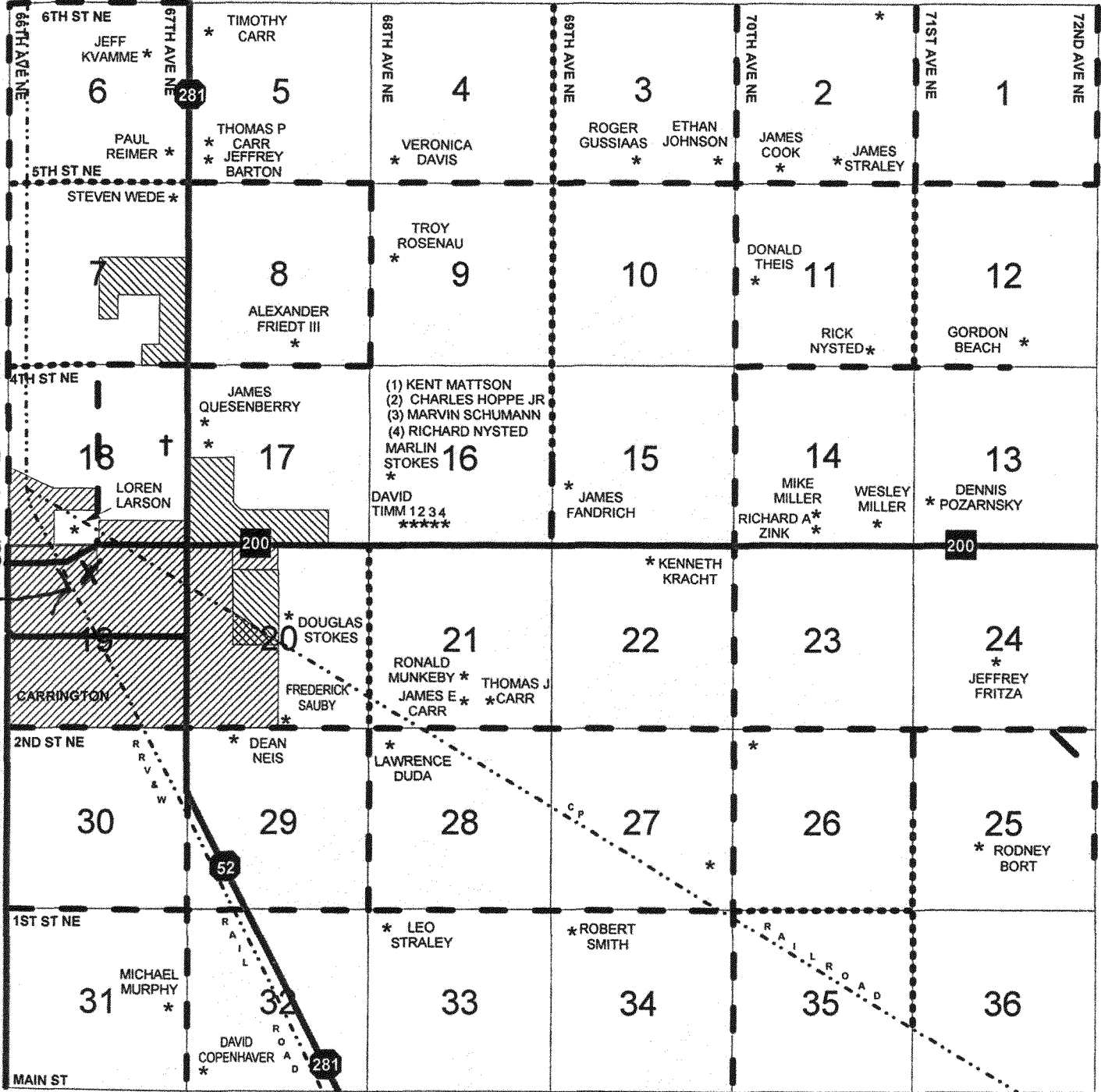
