DESCRIPTION/INTEGRITY/ELIGIBILITY

This rural one-room school has wood frame construction, a gabled roof covered with wood shingles, exterior walls covered with horizontal wood lap siding, and a foundation of poured concrete. Basement/cellar was not observed. Five 2-over-2 double hung windows are on the east side of the structure, two blinded windows are on the north end, a single 1-over-1 double hung window is near the south end of the west side, and a 2-pane fixed window and a non-original wood panel door are on the south end of the building. A brick chimney exits the roof peak near the north end.

The property retains fair to good integrity as a post-1900 era rural school. Integrity of feeling, materials, and workmanship have been eroded slightly by blinding of windows on the north end and replacement of the door. Integrity of setting and feeling may have been eroded slightly by the removal of the privies and possibly a stable which were commonly associated with rural schools.

The date of construction is not known, but the structure was probably built during the period of initial homestead settlement of the area, 1904-1915. A 1919 county atlas (Ogle 1919) shows a school at this location, on land owned by F.K. Randash, and the school is still known as the Randash School. In 1975-76, the Randash School was one of two

rural schools still operating in Golden Valley County. photograph of the Randash School shows 13 students, but by 1975 the two rural schools had a combined enrollment of only 12 students (Sentinel Butte Bicentennial Committee 1976:419, 421). Golden Valley County deed records do not indicate the date of construction of the school; the property does not appear to have been transferred from private ownership (Golden Valley County Register of Deeds, Personal Communication to Kurt Schweigert 8/17/90).

SUMMARY OF SITE FEATURES: Gabled frame school described on page 1A above. This building and site do not appear to be eligible for nomination to the National Register under any of the Criteria for Eligibility. The property retains fair to good integrity of design, materials, workmanship, and feeling, but it has lost some integrity of location and setting through removal of privies and possibly other structures from the site. The property is associated with the broad patterns of rural education and rural settlement in North Dakota, but the property is one of perhaps several hundred similar buildings in the state and is not exceptionally representative of its property type. The property also does not appear to be especially important in local or regional history, as is indicated by lack of substantial coverage in the available county history (Sentinel Butte Bicentennial Committee 1976).




