The feature is a one room prairie school on a concrete foundation. The gable roof of the main body and the shed roof of the entry are covered with wood shakes with some metal capping. There is a yellow brick chimney at the west end at the peak of the roof. The soffits are closed. The pyramid top of the bell tower with the flagpole attached at the peak sits in the school yard. The building measures 30 feet east to west and 20 feet north to south with the shed measuring 10 feet east to west by 16 feet north to south.

There is a wide trim board on the exterior wall under the soffits on the peak ends of the roof. The remaining siding is 6 inch wood lap with 6 inch wood corner trim. All the corners have a piece of metal sheeting, about 3 feet high, wrapped around them to keep racoons and other varmints out of the school. There are two windows on the east side of the entry, both covered. Three shuttered double hung windows, two over two, on the north side and three more, two uncovered, on the south have framing and some glass. A 5 panel wood door goes into the entry. The north half of the entry is completely unfinished and was most likely used for fuel storage. Another 4 panel wood door leads into the school proper. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood. The walls are beadboard, hung horizontally, and there is vertical beadboard for wainscot. The ceiling also has beadboard. There are two blackboards on the east wall, either side of the door. On the west wall is an old coal/wood burning stove with stove pipe still connected to the chimney. No evidence of electricity.

This school was built in 1908 and was name TD School after the ^{TD} Ranch located three miles north of this original location. It closed in 1937.
