The feature is a one room prairie school on a poured concrete foundation. The gable roof is covered with ribbed metal sheeting. At the peak near the south end is a bell tower. The base of the bell tower is wood with lap siding to finish, the four corner posts hold a pyramidal roof, also covered with metal sheeting. There is a bell in the tower. The chimney is gone. The soffits are closed. The building measures 32 feet north to south and 20 feet east to west.

There is a wide trim board on the wall under the soffits on the peak ends. The remainder of the siding is 6 inch wood lap with 6 inch wood corner trim. The entry to the school is located at the north side, a 4 panel wood door with a window at the top leads into the entry from the east side. There is one small window to the right of the entry door and another smaller, double hung one the west wall of the entry. Yet one more small windows it on the north wall. There is a 4 panel door, at a concrete step, that gives entry on the south side. A closed in area above the door and other straight line wood cuts make we wonder what this looked like originally. The interior walls of the school are composite wall tiles. The ceiling has 12 inch composite tiles. The hardwood floor is covered with linoleum, failing in places. At the north end of the main room there is a stage that spans the room, side to side. A 5 panel wood door opens into the entry at the west end of the north wall. A blackboard covers the east half of the north wall. The windows in the main room are 4 sets of two double hung, two over two, windows with glass intact. Light fixtures, in and out, suggest electricity.

This school was built in 1907 and operated until 1929, closed and then opened again to serve area families from 1944 to 1964.

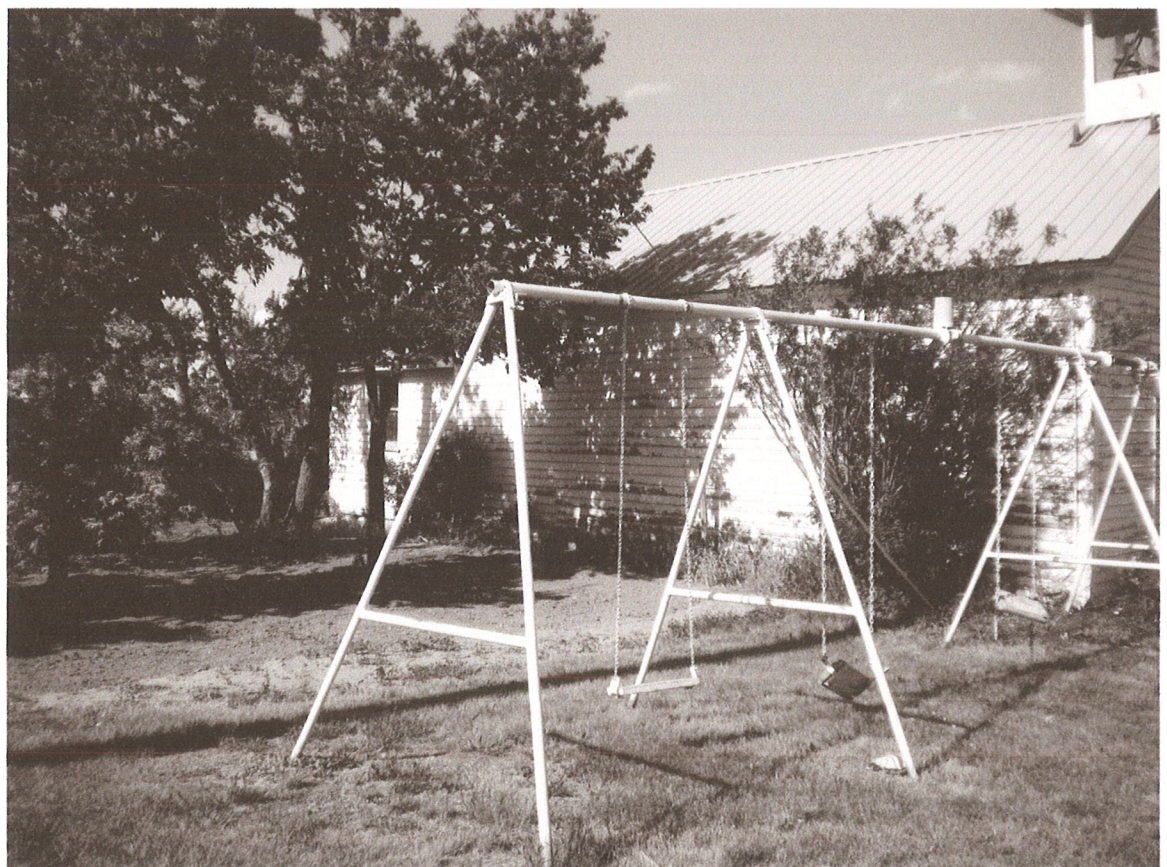

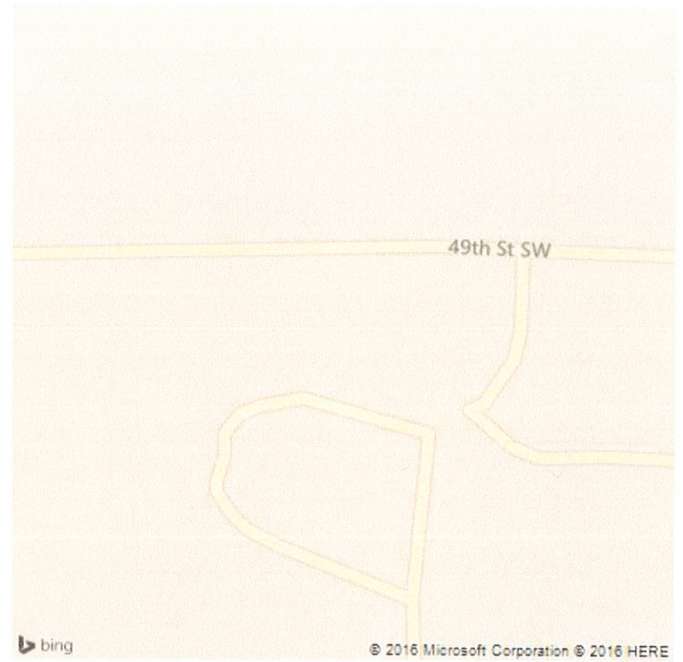
