DESCRIPTION/INTEGRITY/ELIGIBILITY:

Feature 1 consists of a 1 1/2 story schoolhouse, which is an end gable structure with a dropped roof side gable addition on the east end of the building. The main structure measures 26.4 ft (8 m) east west by 18.4 ft (5.6 m) north-south. The roof is covered by asphalt shingles with open eaves and enclosed rafters. The exterior is clad in beveled weatherboard with metal endboards. The eastern façade contains a single window opening offset to the south that has been boarded over with plywood. A doorway is north of this window, which is now covered by the addition. The southern elevation of the main structure contains four window openings that have been covered with plywood sheets. A fifth window on the western end still retains its original condition as a 1/1 double hung window. There are no windows on the west and north elevations. The eastern addition measures 10 ft (3 m) by 10 ft (3 m) and has a dropped side gable roof covered by wood shingles. A ridge cap with purlins extends along the ridge. The eaves are extended with enclosed rafters. The exterior is clad in beveled weatherboard with metal endboards. The southern façade contains a 5-panel wooden plank door. This leads out to a concrete step with a concrete patio measuring 6 ft (1.8 m) north-south by 10 ft (3 m) east-west. The eastern elevation contains a centrally-located window opening that has been boarded over by a plywood sheet. Both the main structure and the addition rest on a crumbling concrete foundation.

County roads border the site to the north and east, and pasture borders the site to the south and west. A faded two-track road encircles the structure. Two other features were identified by Dill, an outhouse and a concrete foundation, though the outhouse is no longer standing. An examination of the ground surface around the site failed to reveal any significant historic artifacts beyond pieces of clear glass and miscellaneous metal fragments. The site measures 492 ft (150 m) east-west by 377 ft (115 m) north-south for a total area of 4.3 acres (1.7 ha).

Historic Information:

Site 32ME269 is on land originally acquired by Herman Johnson in 1905 by means of a cash patent. He resided in Mercer County at the time, but not on the property. Herman had moved to Clark County, South Dakota, by the time he sold the property to Edwin Young in 1911. Edwin Young, who resided in Bryant, South Dakota, was also an absentee landowner. Edwin owned the property until 1919, when Philip and Emma Morast purchased it. The Morast family resided on a farm (site 32ME715) located adjacent to the property. Philip and Emma owned the property until 1961, when their son, Raymond, acquired the property title. Raymond and his wife, Elma, sold the property in 1992 to their four children (Barry, Monte, Jolene and Kelly), who are currently listed as joint owners of the property.

The Woodrow School was established on the property in 1919, the same year that Philip and Emma Morast acquired title to the property. The specific nature of the arrangement between the school district and the Morast family for placement of a school on the property is unknown. The Woodrow School posted its first certified enrollment in 1919 and continued in operation until 1963, when it posted its last certified enrollment (Mercer County School Board, personal communication 2002).

Feature 1 is a standing structure recorded on a NSCRS architectural form.

Feature 2 consists of the concrete foundation of an outhouse located 75 ft (23 m) west of the schoolhouse. The foundation measures 3.8 ft (1.2 m) by 3.8 ft (1.2 m) with a 1 ft (.3 m) square opening in the southeast corner of the foundation.

Feature 3 consists of the remains of the wooden outhouse identified as a standing structure by Dill (1978). The depression is 23 ft (7 m) south of Feature 2 and measures roughly 3 ft (.9 m) by 3 ft (.9 m) with a depth of less than 1 ft (.3 m). There are several wood fragments scattered near the area.




