Almost all of the interior furnishings have been removed, and the exterior is in poor condition. The southern portion of the interior has been divided into two rooms; a coat room and a storage room. A vestibule extends to the south. Most of the building is a single main room. Someone has been shooting birds within the building, destroying most of the ceiling. The internal walls are wood lath covered with fiber board and then covered with plaster and blue and white paint. The remaining ceiling is wainscoting. The floor is wood plank. We believe the site retains integrity of location, design, materials, workmanship, feeling, setting and association.

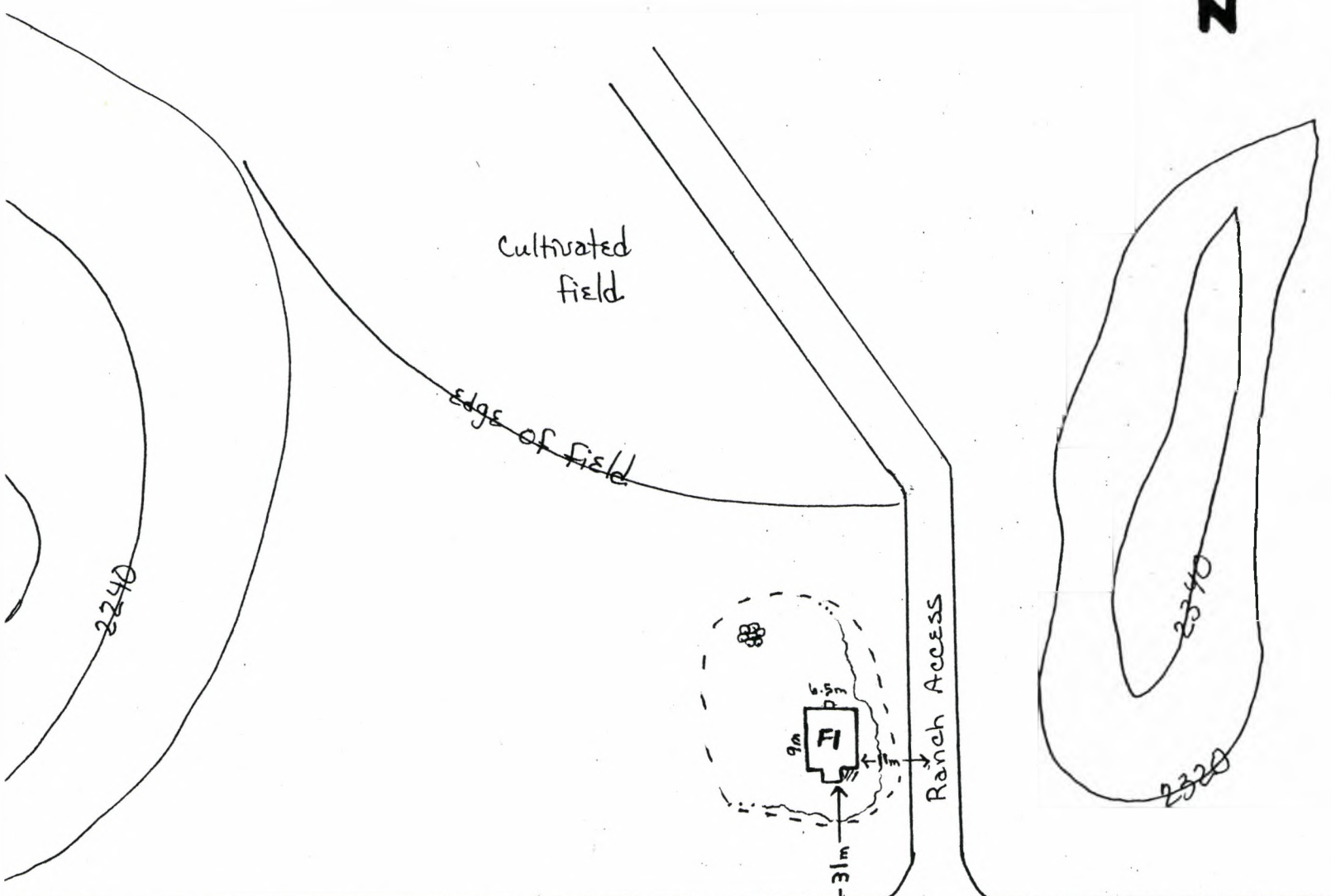

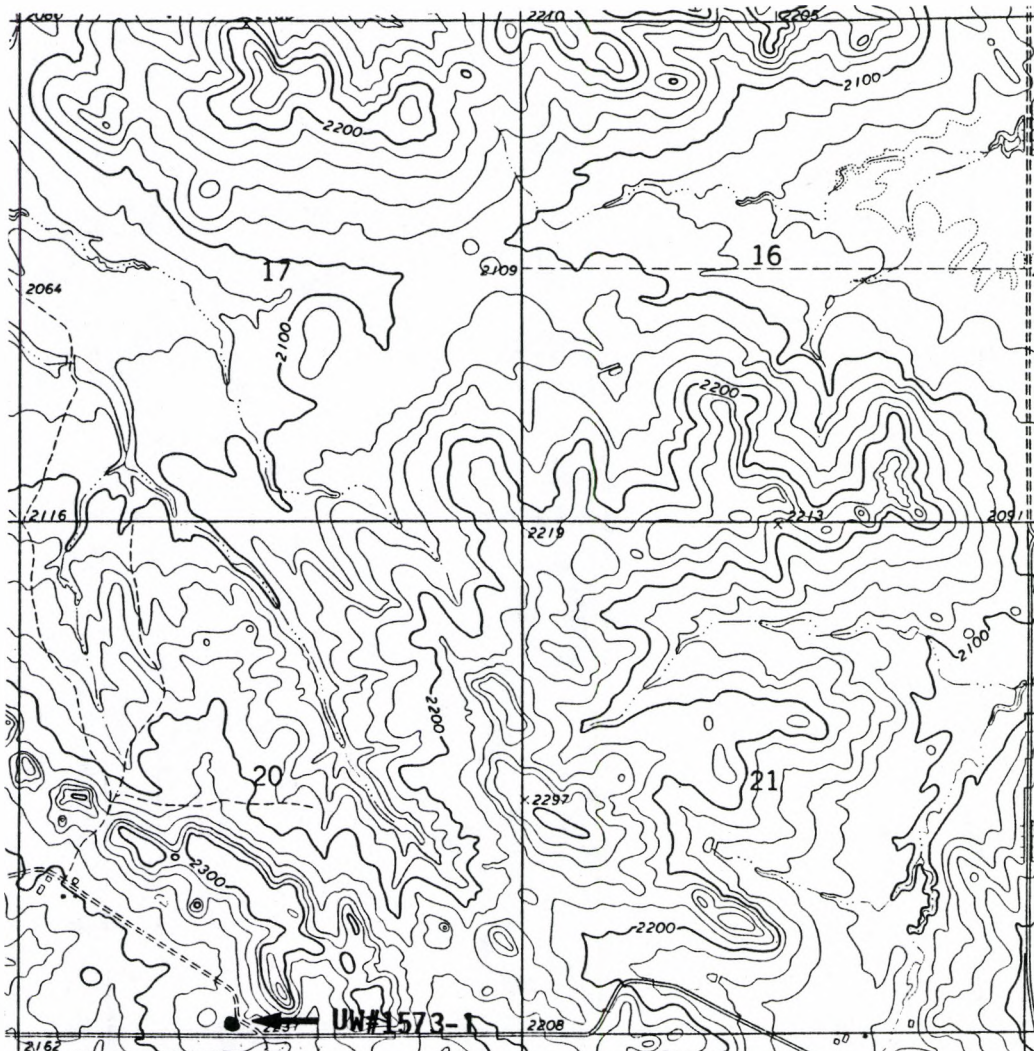
