Sauer School is located on a farm and is used for storage. The original location was two miles east of where it sits today. The school sits on a concrete foundation. This is a woodframed building with horizontal wood siding. The paint is fresh and it looks very nice. There are four windows on the east side of the main school room and another on the east side the entry the entry. All the windows have shutters and a few of them are open for natural light in the building. The windows are double hung. The corners of this building are trimmed with 1 X 4 inch lumber. There are four more windows on the west side and all of them are shuttered. On the west side of the entry there is a small, hinged door that was most likely the coal bin door. Roofing material is asphalt shingles in very good shape. The south side of the school has no windows. The entry is on the north side and there is a small, concrete step. The school measures 18.6 feet east to west and 38 feet north to south.

In the entry there is wainscoating on the lower 1/3 of the wall and the lines run horizontally. To the right is the old coal room, full of farm equipment. There is lathe and plaster in the entry and wall board in the main room of the school. Tongue and groove flooring completes the building. The walls are covered with peg board and shelving for use as a workshop/storage facility.

The school had electric lights. School records were submitted until about the mid 1950's, maybe about 1954. I think this school was one of the Sverdrup Schools and was called Sauer because of the family nearest the school. The original location is in Sverdrup School District #9.

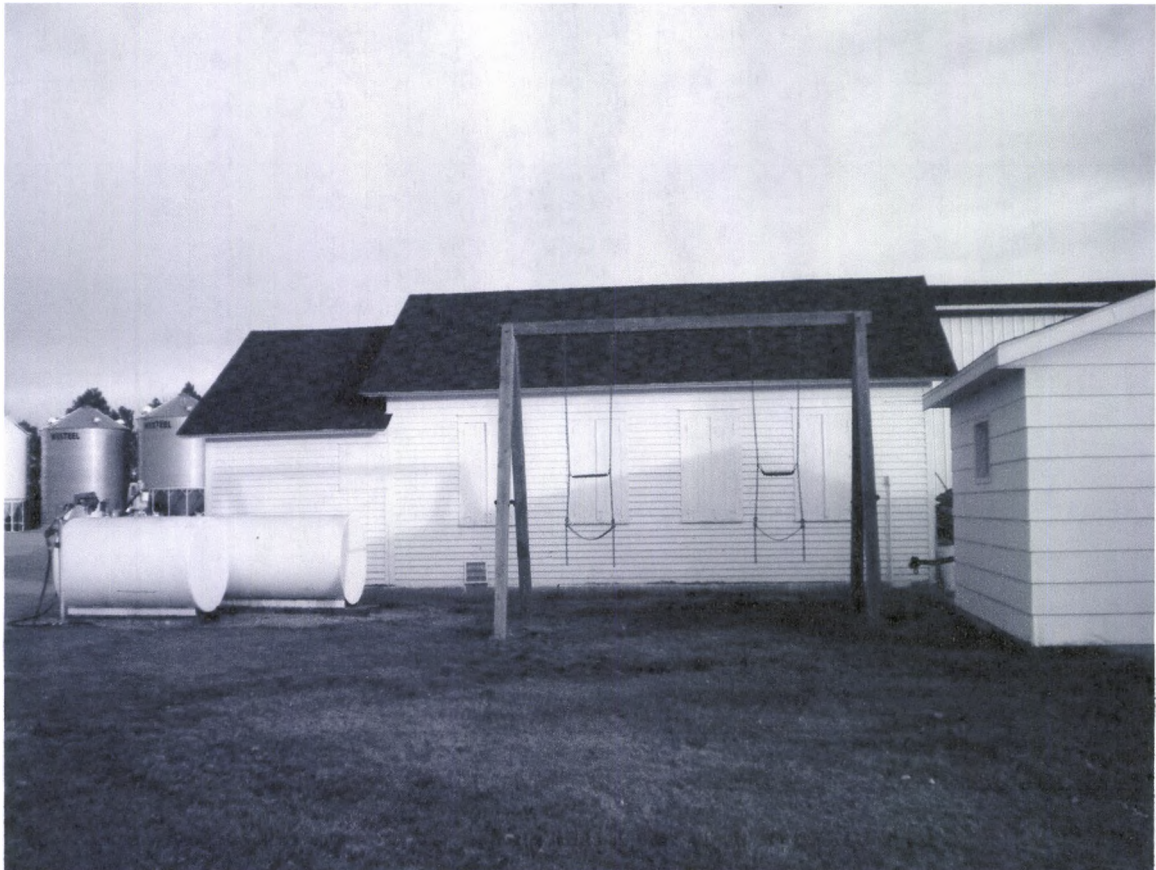
