The story of th feature is included in the 2014 documentation. The only change I see since it was documented in 2014 is that the east side window in the entry and a window on the south side of the school have been boarded up.

The interior of the school is in fair shape. The walls and ceiling are finished with lathe and plaster. Some of the ceiling plaster is starting to fall in. Wainscot is seen under the windows the blackboards. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood. There are two blackboards on the north wall to either side of the chimney. There is an oil burning stove connected to the chimney. Light fixtures would indicate the presence of electricity.

DESCRIPTION: Feature 1 is a one-room schoolhouse with a small mudroom attached to the south facade. Both the schoolhouse and the mudroom have moderately-pitched front-gabled roofs and horizontal wood clapboard siding. The entire building has recently been painted white. The mudroom stands about five feet shorter than the main schoolhouse. There is a small wooden deck in front of the mudroom. Two entrances are located along the south facade of the mudroom. The westernmost door leads into the mudroom, wherein an interior door leads into the schoolhouse itself. The eastern door leads down to a cellar. Both doors are wood-paneled with simple frames and are painted white. There is an electrical hook-up and light fixture directly beneath the roof apex of the mudroom. Both the schoolhouse and mudroom have wood shingles underneath a more recent layer of interlocking asphalt shingles. There is one wood-framed, double-hung window, which is missing glass in the top pane, on the east face of the mudroom, and another on the west. Six double-hung windows, all set right next to each other, are located on the west facade of the main schoolhouse portion. It appears that the outer panes of these windows have been replaced with new metal-framed panes. There is another set of paired double-hung windows on the south facade of the schoolhouse portion with a wooden frame. The north and east facades of the main building have no windows. A basement window was once located below the northernmost windows, but it has since been boarded up. There is a small round vent with thatched metal wiring just above it. A brick chimney is located at the northern end of the roof. The building has a closed soffit and has decorative trim along the roof edge. A cellar hatch is located at the south end of the western facade.

INTEGRITY: Feature 1 retains integrity of location, setting, design, workmanship, and feeling. Integrity of materials has been slightly impacted by the addition of new metal frames to the windows on the west facade. Overall, the feature in good condition and retains integrity.

ELIGIBILITY: Feature 1 has not been evaluated for eligibility to the National Register of Historic Places. Current survey data are not sufficient to determine significance. Until a deed search can be performed, avoidance is recommended.

Feature 1 is a one room schoolhouse with an attached mudroom. Feature 2, located directly north of the schoolhouse, is an outhouse.

The site retains integrity of location, setting, design, and workmanship. Integrity of materials has been impacted by the addition of new metal frames to the windows in Feature 1, while integrity of feeling is reduced due to the overall poor condition of Feature 2.

This site has not been evaluated for eligibility to the National Register of Historic Places. Current survey data are not sufficient to determine significance. Until a deed search can be performed, avoidance is recommended.
