1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

The feature is a large, two room prairie school on a poured concrete basement. The school served the small village of Charbonneau. The hip roof of the school has remnants of both asphalt shingles and wood shakes with horizontal slats visible. Metal capping with finials can be seen at the peak of the roof with remnants on the ribs of the roof. There are holes in the roof. The soffits were closed at construction but today much of that is failing. There is a red brick chimney at the south end of the west slope. The building measures 36 feet east to west and 45 feet north to south.

The siding begins with a rake board under the eaves on all four sides of the school. The remainder of the siding is 6 inch wood lap with 6 inch corner trim finished with waterboard. A large concrete porch is seen on the west side of the school with concrete steps leading up to it. The west wall has two door openings with small window openings to either side of each door. The door's lead into separate coatrooms. Each has shelving along the center wall with remnants of doors made from beadboard. There is a stairway leading down into the basement from one of the entries. There are door openings (one has a 5 panel wood door) leading from the coatrooms into each half of the school. A bank of 7 double hung window openings is located on both the north and south sides. There is no glass an little framing. The walls and ceiling were finished with lathe and plaster and much of the plaster is laying on the floor. The wall in one of the coat rooms has wainscot. Blackboards are gone. The floor is hardwood. There is a large opening between the two rooms with partial walls to the north and south and folding doors. One of the 5 panel doors is left. The basement is dirt with concrete shoring up the walls. Light fixtures would indicate the presence of electricity once upon a time.

Feature 14 is located at the southern boundary of the town of Charbonneau. It is 40' x 50' with a hipped roof and vertical wood siding. It is highly weathered but paint remnants suggest it was white. It has a row of seven windows on the northeast wall and a chimney on the northwest side. Its location and layout suggest it was not residential and may have been a schoolhouse, town-hall or some other type of public meeting place. Due to the deteriorated condition which is a result of neglect, this structure has lost most of its historic integrity and should be considered non-contributing to the town site of Charbonneau and not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.
