1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:			

The main gable portion of this building made up the former school house and had an entrance on the south side. Originally three windows on both the east and west sides allowed natural light in the main room. Now the west side has two sliding windows in the upper portion of the north and south windows with the remaining opening below the new window and the middle window filled in. The east side now has two picture windows with a double hung window on the side (total windows are mirror images). The chimney no longer exists but the hole where it came out of the roof is open. A hip roof addition replaced the original entrance and has one two-over-two window centered on the south wall. The north end of the building has a shed roof addition with a double hung window towards the middle of the wall and two smaller double hung windows on the upper east corner of the wall. Two tall and large pipes extend up from this corner. A second addition connects to the north addition and extends east but has a gable roof with exposed rafter ends. The north side of this addition has one double hung window in the middle of the wall. The south side of this last addition has a wood door with two-over-three lights over two panels flanked on both sides by double hung windows. Both north additions have wood shingles while the main gable and south addition have asphalt shingles. Due to the three additions and changes to all of the windows, this building has lost significant integrity so as to be ineligible for the National Register.

It should be noted that for a time, around the 1930s, Illinois #2 School had as many African-American students as white students, including Mr. Collins and his cousins. The African-American students were children of George Whiteside. His children's names were Jimmy, Evelyn, Lorraine, Vernon, Everett, and Rosemary. Lorraine went on to high school in Lakota and then to the University of North Dakota Law School. She practiced law in Park River, ND. Mr. Collins believed Lorraine's married name was Peterson. While the Whitesides lived in the Bartlett area their home burned down. They then lived temporarily in the Collins' home.

Mr. Collins recalled the names and chronology of the teachers at the school: Edith Metcalf, then Frances Metcalf, and then Jean Tierney. The Illinois #2 school grounds included a schoolhouse, barn (to stable horses and park sleighs), a storage building, and an outhouse. Within the last 4-5 years, the barn, storage building, and outhouse were removed.
