This feature is a wood framed one room prairie school located in a pioneer village. It was moved from Dayton Township to this location September 7, 1994 to be part of the village. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles and at the east end there is a dormer with a three pane window. The eaves are enclosed with vinyl soffits. There is a small pipe on the north slope of the school, not sure what it is used for.

The school has vinyl siding which replaces the wood lap siding, done about 3 or 4 years ago. Wires on the south side of the school indicate electricity. Vents can be seen at the bottom of the north and south walls allow for air movement under the school. The walls inside the school are of lathe and plaster. Flooring is tongue and groove hardwood. A look in the windows show the school is furnished with desks and other items from early schools. The entry area has bathrooms to the south side and a coat room to the north. There are 5 large, double hung, multipane windows on the west wall of the school, all covered with screens. A double hung, multipane window is located at the east end of the south side, another is located at the east end of the north side. The east side has a newer entry door with a transom above it. To either side of the door are windows (two each side), again double hung and multipane but smaller than the others. The building was locked so I could not go inside.

There is blackboard on the east wall, backed by the coat room. Two more blackboards are in the school, one on the north wall and another on the south.

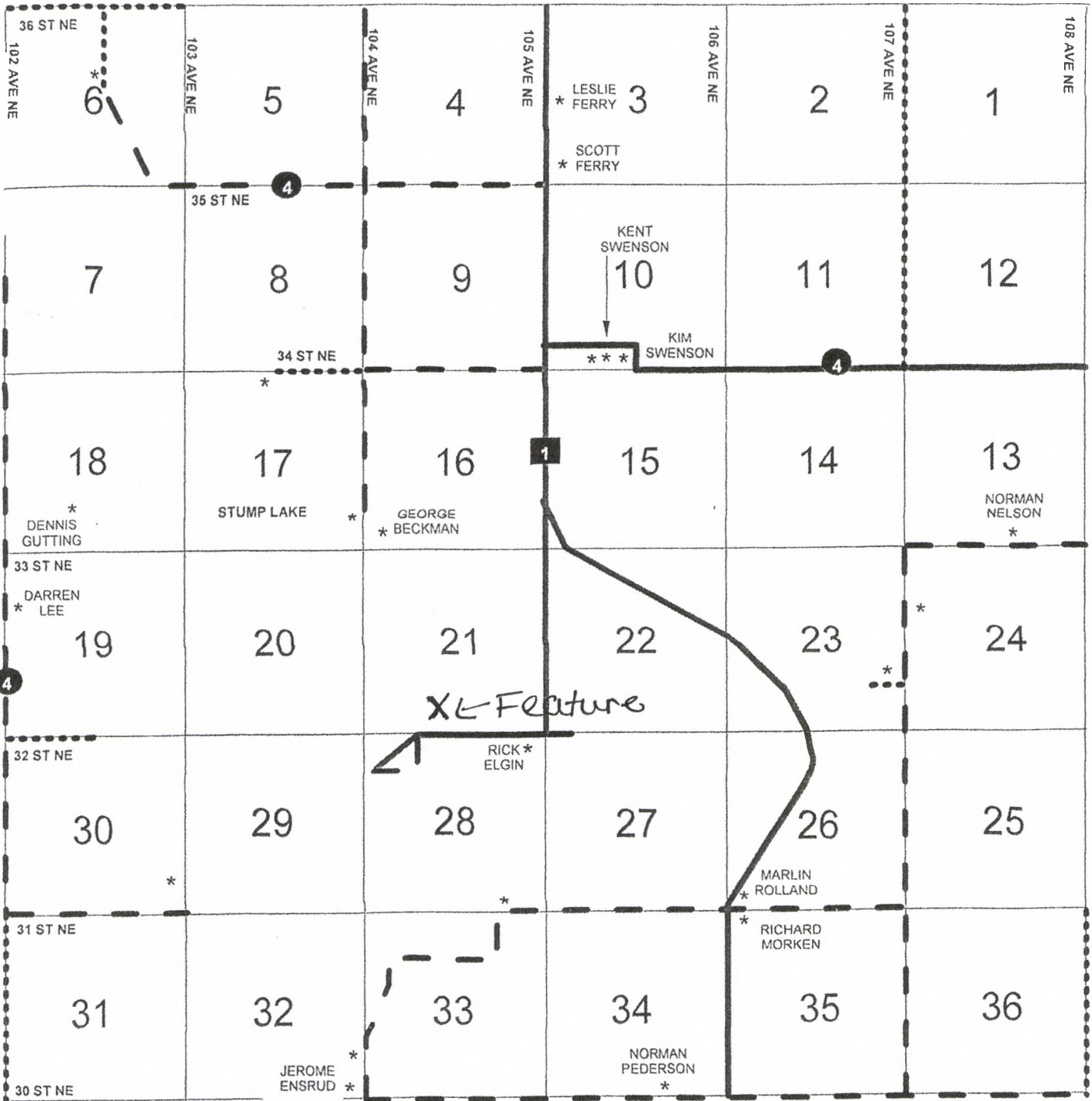
