The feature is a one room prairie school sitting on a concrete foundation. The school was moved from Nanson to this museum complex in 1989. This is a wonderful example of a one room school, decorated with items of the time. The desks, books, maps and other items are original to the school.

The gable roof of the school and entry are covered with asphalt shingles. There is a bell tower at the peak of the north end of the roof. The base of the tower is a square structure with 6 inch lap siding with four posts holding up the pyramid roof, also covered in asphalt shingles. There is a flag pole at the peak of the bell tower. There is a red brick chimney at the peak of the roof at the south end of the school. The soffits are closed. The roof on the entry is gable with extension shed roof to the west. The building measures 24 feet north to south and 18 1/2 feet east to west with the shed measuring 8 feet north to south by 14 feet east to west.

There is a wide trim board under the soffits at the peak ends of the school as well as the entry. The siding is 6 inch wood lap with 4 inch wood corner trim. The concrete foundation is skirted with metal sheeting. There is a plywood door on the entry and this is kept locked. Inside the entry there is a plank door giving access to the west 1/2, used for storage today. The floor in the entry was replaced with newer 4 inch wood planks. The floor in the main body of the school has tongue and groove hardwood.

There are windows of various sizes, the entry has a 4 pane fixed window on the west and a small, 3 pane fixed window on the north, two narrow windows are above the blackboard on the east wall. 5 double hung, 2 over 2, windows are on the west wall. Glass is intact in all windows. Walls and ceiling in the school are wallboard with wainscot on the lower third. There are two more smaller blackboards, one to the left of the entry door and another on the east 1/3 of the south wall. There is a nonfunctioning wood or coal burning stove. Electric lights hang from the ceiling.

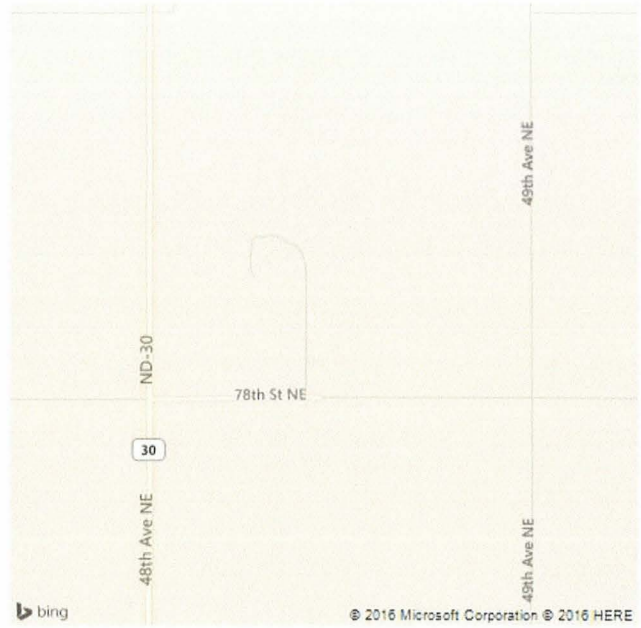
