This is a very tired, wood framed, one room prairie school building. It is sitting on dirt and has some very serious tilt going on. I do not expect this building to stand for much longer. The shape of the school remains with an entry attached at the east end. Both the east and west endso of the building were opened up for access with equipment. On the east end there is an opening about the size of a garage door and on the west endd they installed a sliging door that opens most of that well....hence the lean! I doubtl there is much holding it up anymore. The roof of the main body is mostly board lumber with remnants of asphalt shingles. The boards at the west end appear to be mostly broken off where they extended beyond the wall. The east end held up a bit better. The entry roof is half hip roof and the asphalt shingles here appear to be intact with metal ridge caps running down the two seams.

The walls are 6 inch lap siding with 4 inch corner trim boards, all without any paint left. There is a bank of four windows on the south side and little remains of the frame work and none of the glass. There is a small window on the south side of the entry, looks like a replacement, slider window. Another smaller opening to the north side of the entry might have been a fuel door. A crooked wooden door can be see on the east side, very likely the entry door. Inside the building there is some remnants of plaster over lathe, wainscoting can be seen on some segments of the walls. The entry walls are beadboard where the wall wasn't removed. Tongue and groove flooring can be seen under the rubble and much of it has heaved. There is little left of the ceiling, some lathe, a few pieces of wall board and electric light fixtures, indicating electricity was present.

Measurements of the building are 18 feet 8 inches north to south and 30 feet 2 inches east to west.

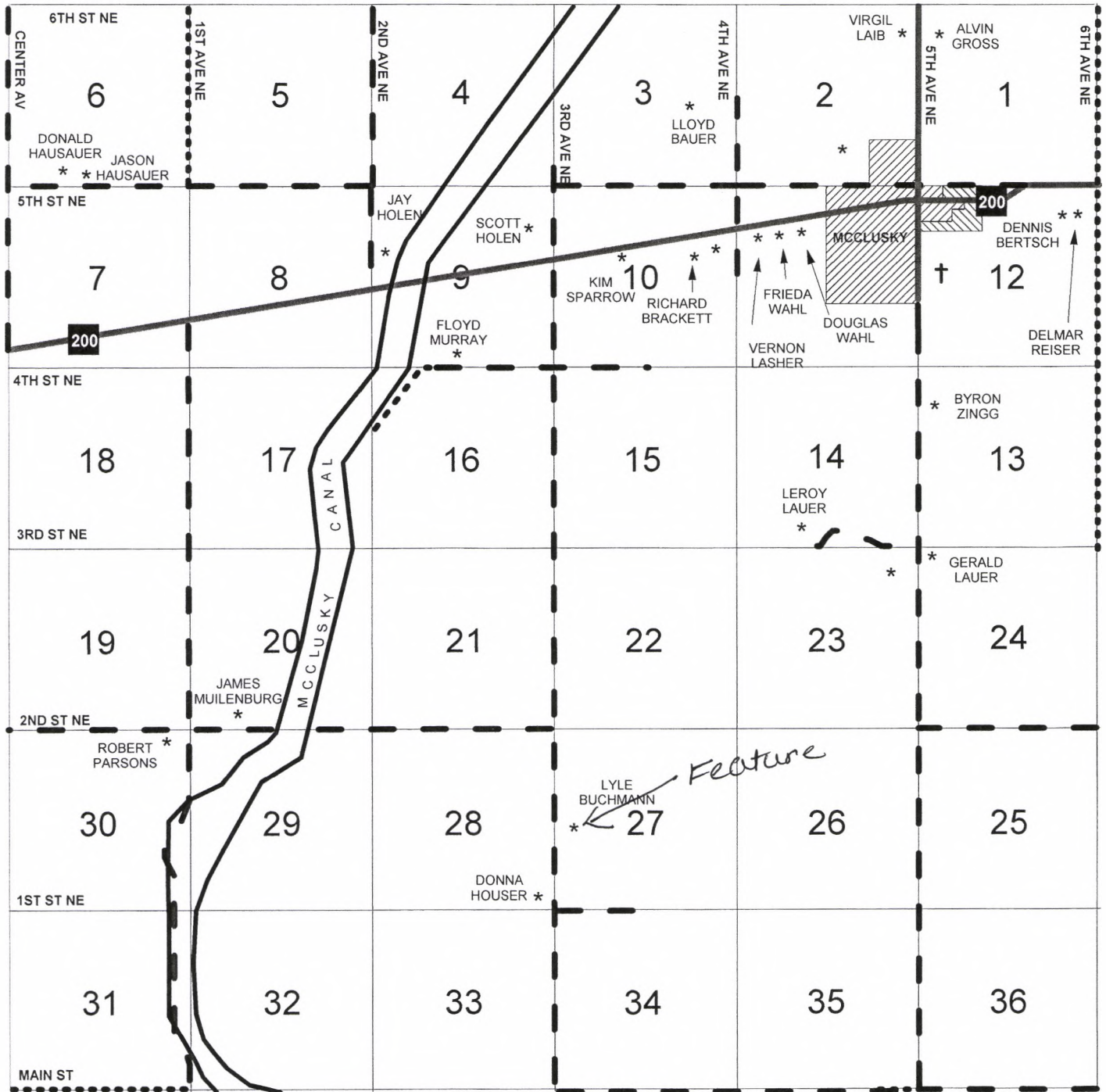
