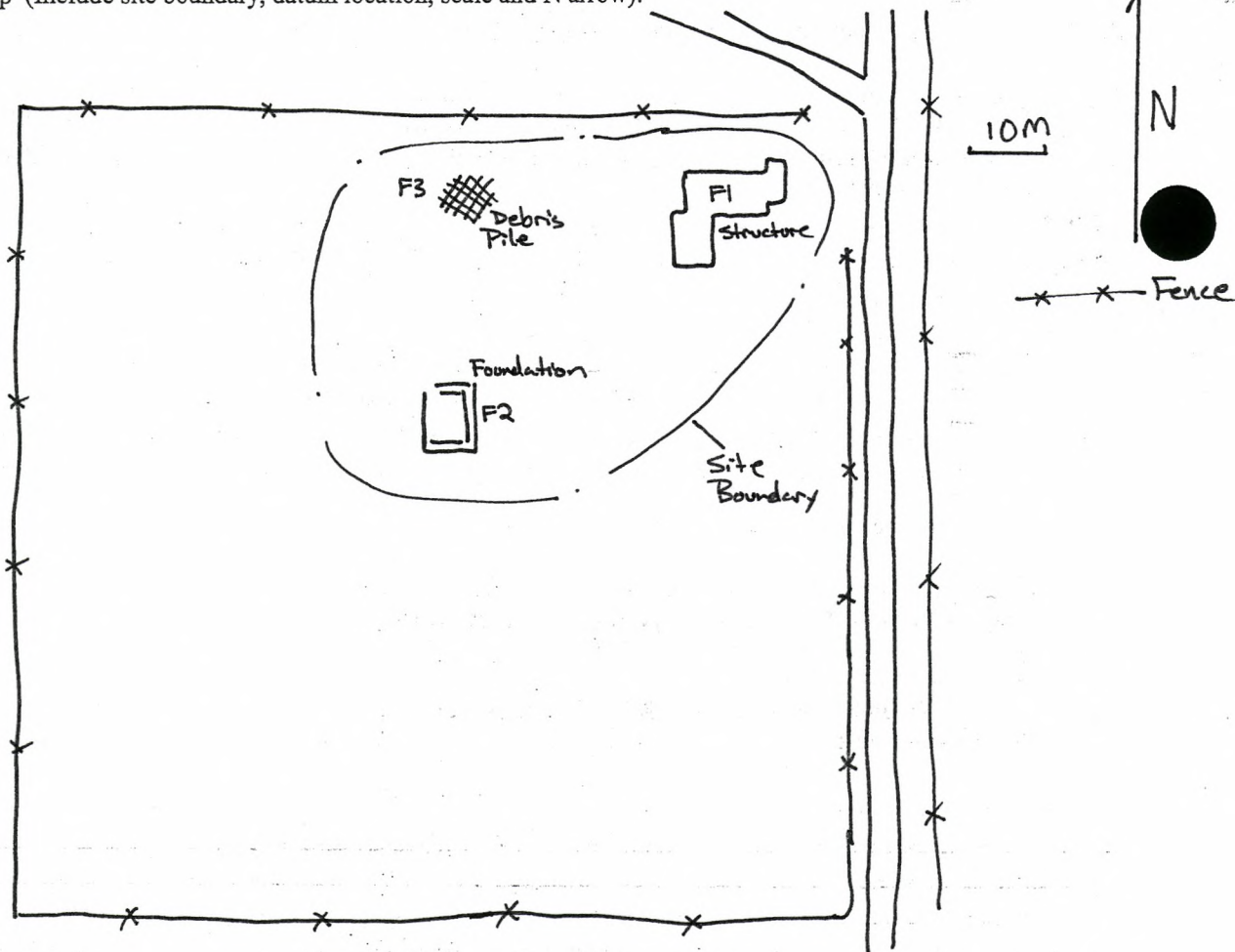

Access From Amidon, ND go 1½ miles west on Hwy 85, continue straight west on F.S. 813 for 16 miles to a T-intersection at the Wolfgram Ranch, turn north for 3 miles, west for 1 mile, north 1 mile, west 1 mile, north 4 miles. Building is on west side of road. The 5 acre tract is fenced in by woven & barbed wire.
2. Description of Site Site consists of a 2½ acre tract fenced on all sides. One standing structure is a wooden frame building. One cement foundation is present. A woodpile of lumber is behind the building. Site was a rural school yard. The building was a school and teacherage. The foundation was a barn. The school was moved into the area ca. 1920 used until 1950.

17. Other Historical Information The Brown School was attended by an average of 12 students from the surrounding township east of the river. It was used from roughly 1920-1950, grades 1-8. In 1933-34 the grades 1-8 and H.S. were taught by Mrs. Emil Hablutzel. The school is written up in the "Slope Area" history book. This information was obtained from Ray Wilkins, Bowman.

20. Statement of Integrity The main building is still intact and contains some original furnishings. Further information could be gained from study of the building.
21. Statement of Significance The site played an important role in the local community during the early 20th Century. Further information could be gained through study of the physical remains and from interviews and deed searches.
22. Comments/References The site may be of local significance. It would contribute to interpretation of Euro-American settlements. Impacts should be clarified and if necessary further investigations undertaken.

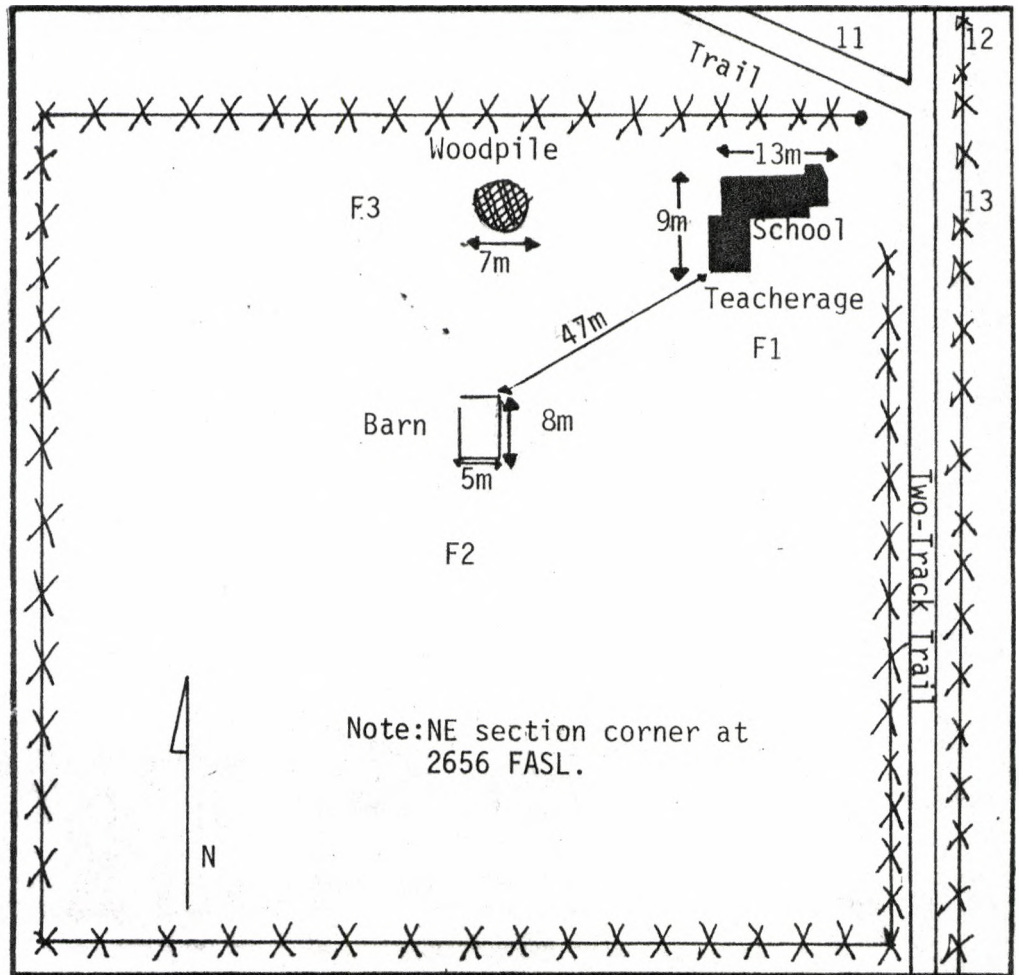

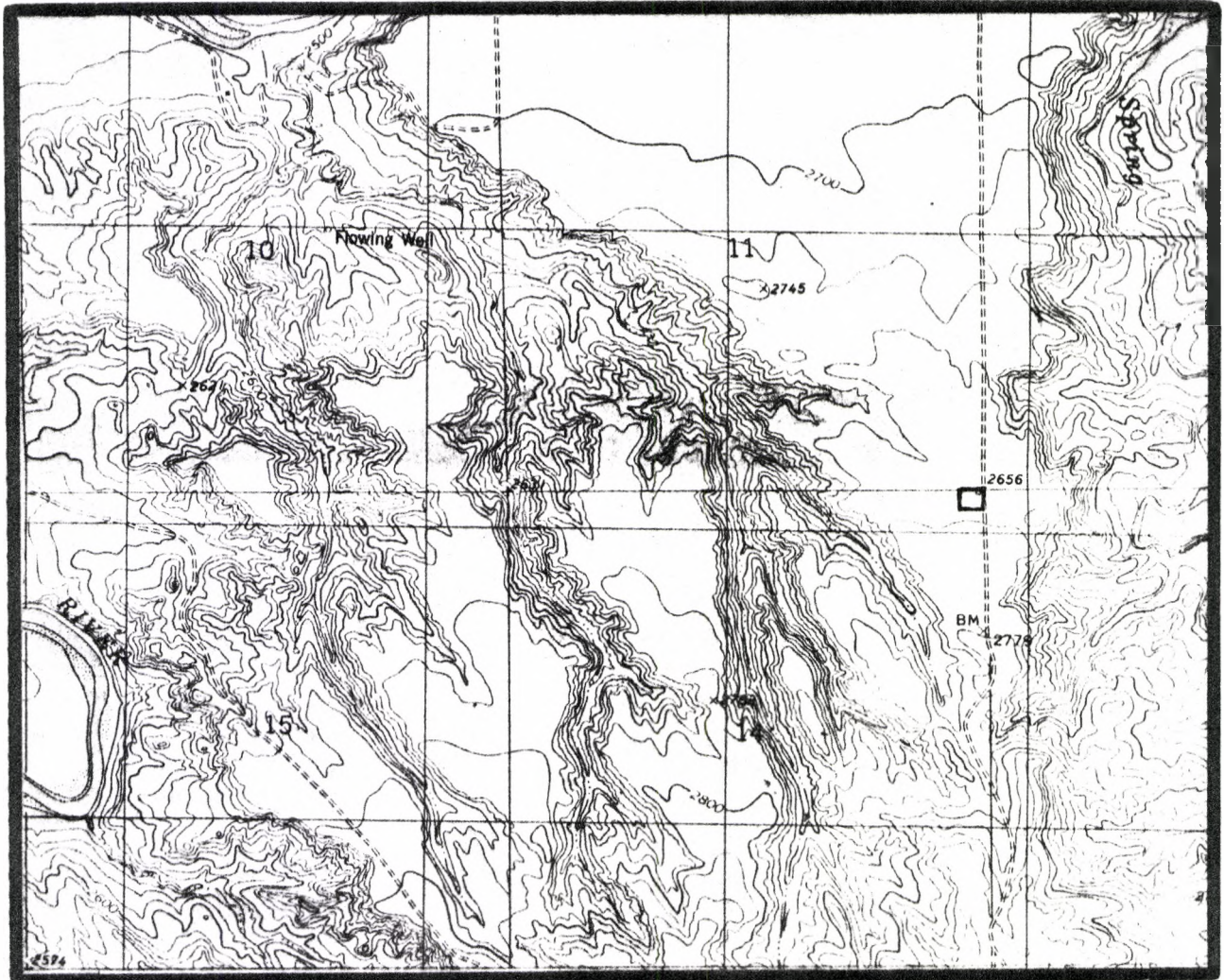
