The feature is a large one room prairie school on a concrete foundation. The school has three distinct parts with a shed to the west, the school room in the middle and the entry/coat room to the east. All the roofing is asphalt shingles and the soffits are closed. There is a red brick chimney near the north end of the school at the peak of the room. Also extending up from the west shed roof are 2 concrete bathroom vents. There are two concrete edged holes off the west end of the school and they had hinged doors to allow removal of bathroom waste. The building measures a total of 48 feet east to west and 20 1/2 feet north to south.

The siding on the school begins with a wide trim board under the peak end of the roof of the school room and continues with 6 inch wood lap with 4 inch corner trim. There are vertical metal sheets covering most of the windows on the south side. The entry has 2 small windows to either side of a newer door, reached from a concrete porch. The entry walls are all beadboard and coat hooks are still located on the walls. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood. A 5 panel wood door leads into the school room. The ceiling is pressed tin with more pressed tin curving at the wall seams and going down to the top of the blackboard. There is a blackboard running the length of the school room on the north wall and another smaller blackboard on the west wall near the stove. The remainder of the walls are also covered with pressed tin. A fuel oil stove is near the west wall. Also on the west wall are two more 5 panel wood doors that lead into the bathrooms. Between the bathrooms there is room for storage. There is a 5 panel wood door on the north wall of the bathroom/shed with a 4 pane fixed window to the left and a small window for light in the bathroom. The same window configuration can be see on the south wall. The school room has a bank of 8 large, double hung windows with many covered and most of the glass remaining. Electric lights and switches suggest electricity was present.
