1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

The feature is a one room prairie school sitting on a poured concrete foundation at the grounds of the Towner County Courthouse. The roof of the school is covered with wood shaked with metal capping. There is a concrete chimney at the west end of the roof at the peak. The soffits are closed.

A rake board begins the siding at the peak ends of the school. The remaining siding is 6 inch wood with 4 inch wood corner trim. The school is recently painted and looks great. Wood steps lead up to a wood platform porch with metal rails to either side. There is a coat room inside the newer solid core entry door. Immediately to the left is a door leading into a storage/fuel room. There is a 5 panel wood door leading from the coatroom into the school proper. The walls and ceiling in the school are lathe and plaster. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood. There is a decorative cornice above the door in the school room. The walls have wainscot. Blackboards are located on the east wall south of the entry door in the school room and along much of the south wall. Five, four over four, double hung windows are on the north wall of the school room with intact glass, curtains on the lower third as well as shades. Another similar window is on the north wall of the coatroom. There is electricity present today. The interior is decorated with items commonly seen in a one room school to include desks, teachers desk, books, a small wood burning stove, pictures of President's Lincoln and Washington and much more.


The school bell sits on the ground near the front entry. Built in 1914 at Elsberry the school was closed in 1942 for 10 years because of reorganization of a portion of the district. Classes were resumed after the school was moved to a new location in the same township. On Julyu 6, 1960 (the school closed after the 1959-1960 school year) the school was deeded to Armourdale township to used as a hall. The school was moved from Armourdale Township to Cando in 1967 for preservation as a pioneeer school museum on the courthouse grounds.


