1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

The feature is a one room prairie school sitting on a concrete pad foundation. The school was moved to this location in 2020 to be used as an exhibit building for the Ward County Historical Society. Just to the southwest of the school is another one room school, North Prairie #1. On the northeast side there is a church. Out the northwest door is an open plaza for the village. The entire village was recently moved to this location. The gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles and there is a metal pipe for a chimney on the southwest slope of the roof. There are also two vents for the bathrooms. The soffits are closed.

The siding is 6 inch wood lap under rake boards at the peak ends of the school. The corner trim is 4 inch wood. There are numerous new double hung windows, three on the northeast side and three similar windows on the southwest side along with two smaller side sliding windows also on the southwest side near the back of the building. One more small side sliding window is located on the southeast side. Two windows are located either side of the entry door on the northwest side. This door as well as another located on the back of the building are new, solid core doors that remain locked. Ramps lead to both entry doors allowing handicapped individuals access. The interior of the school has been completely changed. All the walls have two by fours with insulation added and finished with sheet rock on both the ceiling and the walls. The floors are new planking. There are no blackboards in the building. There is electricity and very soon the building will be heated. At the southeast end of the building they will have two bathrooms to serve the public.

The school was built in 1902. In 1960 it was moved to a location north of Minot and attached to another one room school, Eureka School #4. They were updated at that time and made into two apartments. In 2010 it was used as a consolidated school for a few years. In the summer of 2020 the buildings were sold, separated and moved to the new location.
