### 1. Feature Description, Integrity, Eligibility:

The feature is a one room prairie school on a poured concrete and concrete block foundation. The intersecting gable roofs of the school and the entry are covered with wood shakes with metal capping and finials. The roof of the entry contines with a salt box line to the north to afford cover for a porch, supported at the northwest corner by a post. The soffits are closed. On the peak of the school roof, at the east end it a red brick chimney. On the entry roof is a bell tower with a wood base with lap siding that is holding up the bell tower roof with four corner posts. The pyramidal roof of the bell towner looks to have ship lap for cover. There is a flagpole at the peak of the bell tower. The building measures 20 north and south and 28 east to west with the entry measuring 8 feet by 8 feet exclusive of the open porch.

The siding begins with a wide trim board under the peak on all the ends. The remainder of the siding is 6 inch wood lap with 6 inch wood trim. There is a large, wood porch taking you to the 4 panel wood door. There is a covered window on the south wall of the entry and a covered circle opening above it. the entry walls are finished with beadboard. A four panel wood door leads into the main school room. Along the east wall are pit toilets and further to the north on that wall is a furnace. The north wall has four double hung, two over two, windows with intact glass, there are two sets of two, two over two, windows on the west wall and all the glass is intact. Blackboards are on the south wall, west of the door, between windows on the west wall and another the northwest corner wall. The floor is tongue and groove hardwood with tile on top. Wiring outside and light fixtures inside suggest electricity.
