The feature is a one room prairie school, known as High Cliff School, on a poured concrete basement. The hip roof of the school and the dormer are covered with wood shaked with metal capping and finials. There is a red brick chimney on the east slope above the dormer. The soffits are closed with beadboard. There is a flagpole at the peak of the dormer. One eaves trough with a down spout on the north side of the school. The building measures 34 feet east to west and 20 feet north to south.

There is a wide trim board under the soffits of all sides of the school. The siding is 4 inch wood lap with 64inch corner trim with new paint. There are several small windows in the basement, 2 north, 2 south and 1 west plus a fuel door. There are several circular concrete steps leading the entry stoop and a new solid core locked door. On the north wall there is one boarded up window near the east end and a matching glass block window is on the south wall and both served the coat room along with two more glass block windows either side of the entry. Two large vented glass block windows cover much of the rest of the south wall with one vent boarded up and the other broken. The interior walls are a mixture of lathe and plaster and wallboard. They have opened up the wall from the entry door to the south wall in the east corner and put in a new staircase with wood rail. The interior east wall has built in bookcases to either side of the chimney and a door at the north end leading into the coatroom. There is a small woodburning stove at the east end. The ceiling is wallboard tiles. The floor is wood covered with tile. There is one blackboard on the south 1/2 of the west wall. Light fixtures inside and out suggest electricity.

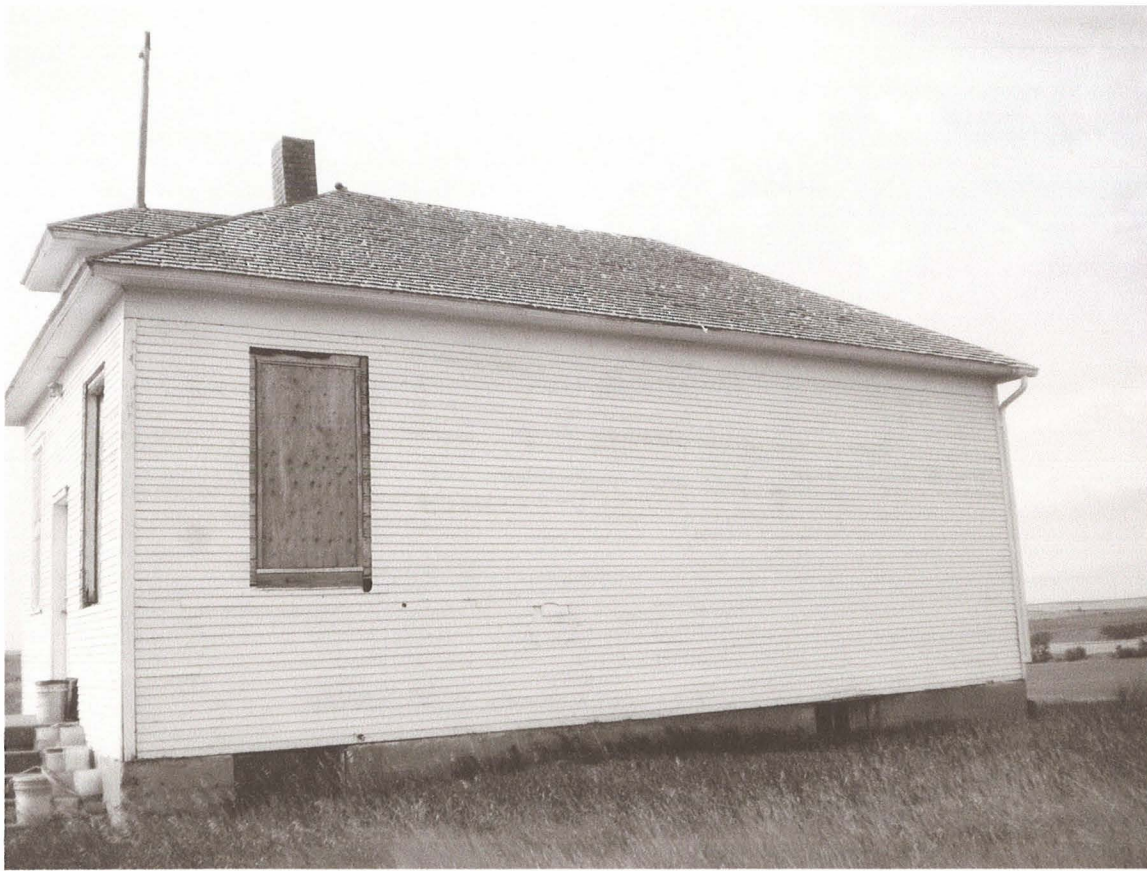
