Sept. 11 - Dinosaur Explore

Participants will walk, crawl, and race as they compare how animals, including dinosaurs, move.

Sept. 25 - Frozen in North Dakota

Participants are encouraged to bring their own toys and clothes inspired by Disney's "Frozen" to see if and how they relate to items on display in the museum.

Oct. 16 - 3-2-1 Blast Off!

Learn about the Hubble Telescope in celebration of our new exhibit.

Sept. 18 - Drawing History

Participants will learn how to record the story of their life, family, or community, as the Plains Indians did with a Winter Count.

Oct. 2 - Cotton to Cloth

Participants can see the transformation of raw materials like cotton and wool to finished textiles with live demonstrations of spinning, knitting, and weaving.
